DETOUR

At sundown last Thursday a group of Shoshone Indians started dancing around a medicine pole, and they will keep at it until about 10 o'clock this morning.

It might as well be confessed that in some parts of the country there are periodic Indian dances given more with an eye toward the tourist trade than with a feeling of spirituality.

The scene of the observance is near Fort Washakie, on the Wind River reservation north of Lander, Wyo. The object is to supplicate the Great Spirit, through the sun god, to bring good health and bounteous crops to all the tribe.

After that comes the job of erecting the enclosure. The medicine pole which is to form the center is hoisted into the air, and presented to the four cardinal points of the compass, before being planted to the accompaniment of prayers by the sponsor.

For three nights and two days no food or water passes his lips. On the fourth morning everybody faces the rising sun and offers thanks and still more prayers, prior to making a break for the river, there to enjoy a well earned—and much needed—bath.

More prayers, and time out for repainting, before the long drum begins. Blowing their whistles in steady cadence, the dancers shuffle from their stalls up to the center pole and back.

This continues until the dancer can dance no more. Exhausted, he retires to his stall to rest and to pray, and to have visions of things to come or things that have vanished from his memory.

At intervals the performers rub the pole with their hands or with eagle wings, thereby transferring that pole's medicine—or the virtues of the medicine—to their bodies.

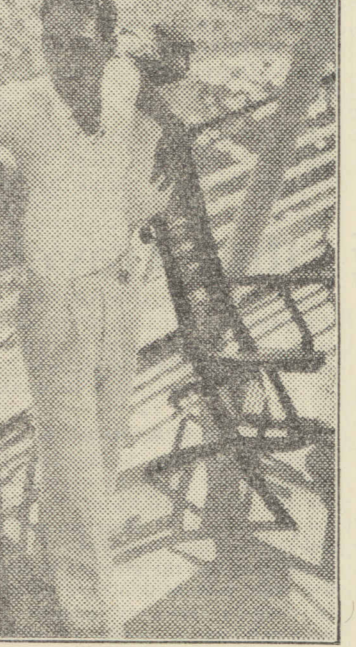
