

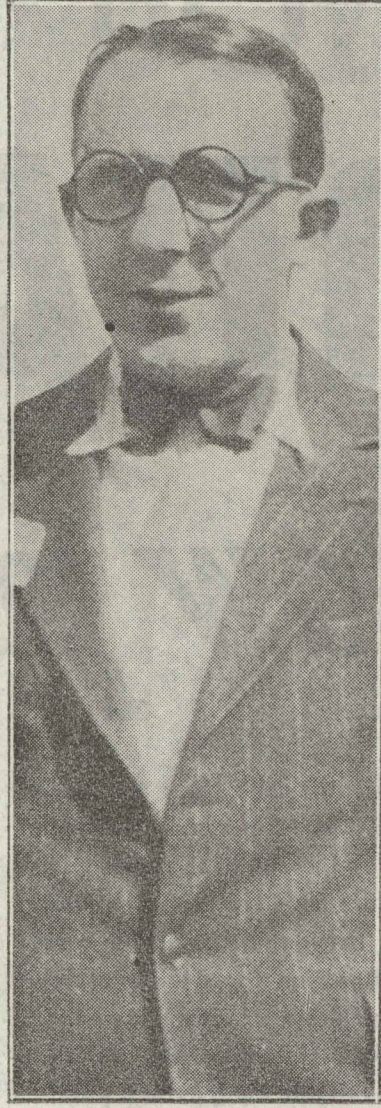
# Lindbergh to Testify in Hauptmann Inquiry—Dillinger Gangster Slain in Attempt to Break Prison

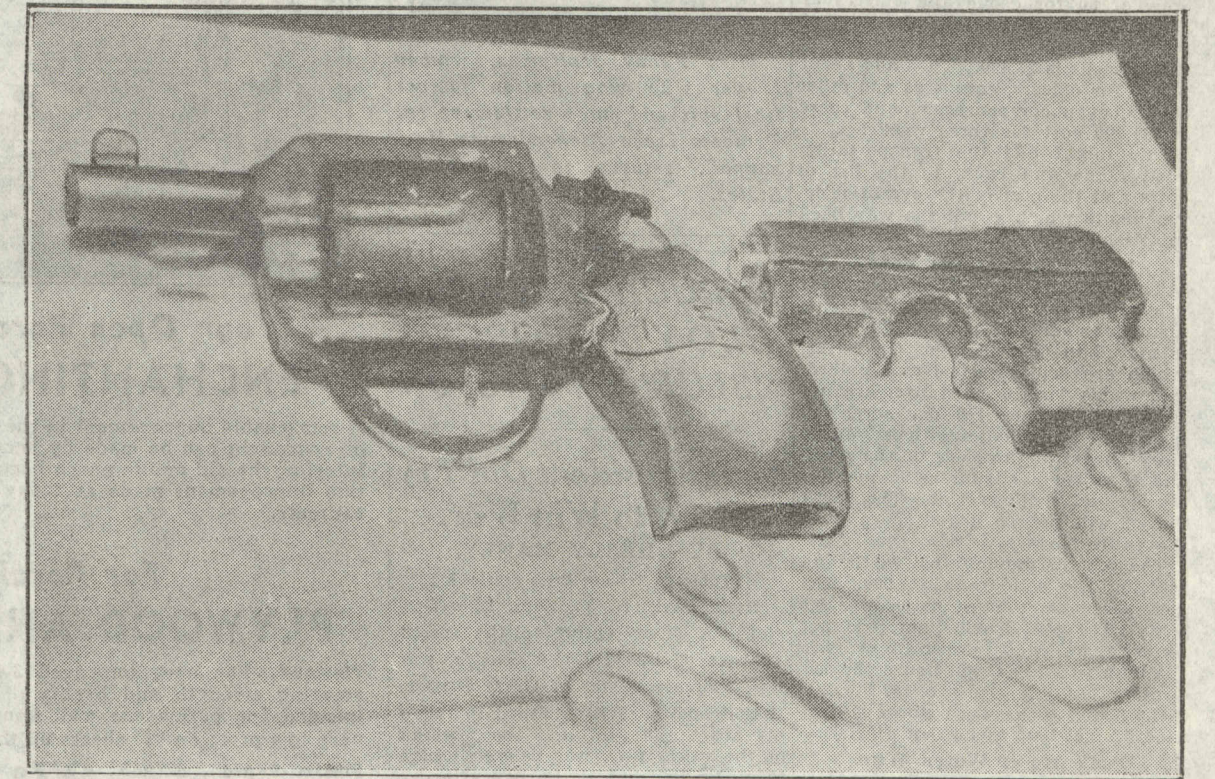

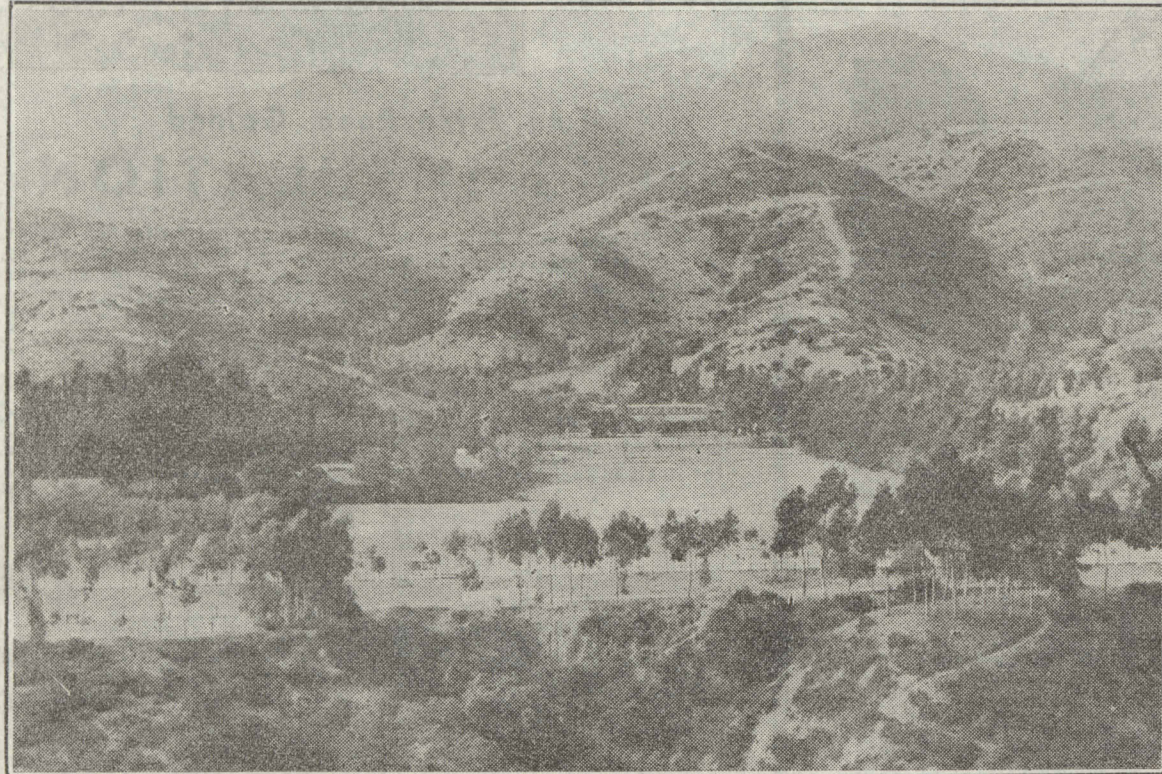

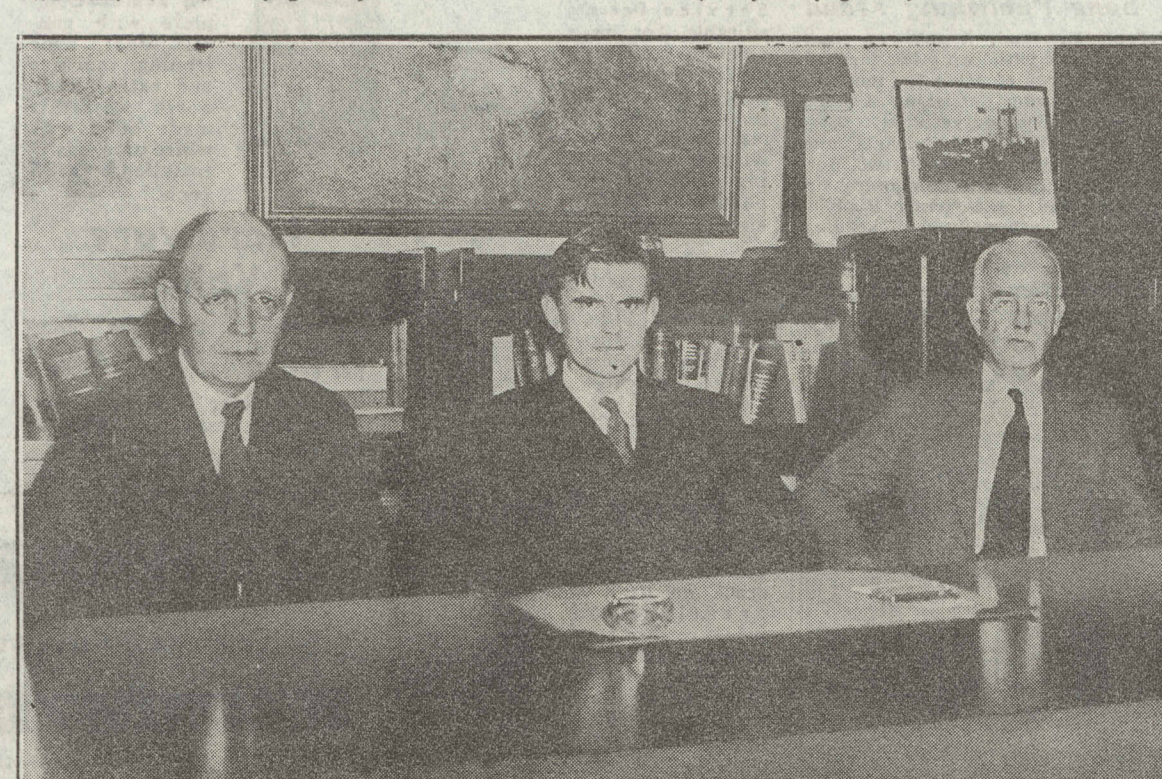

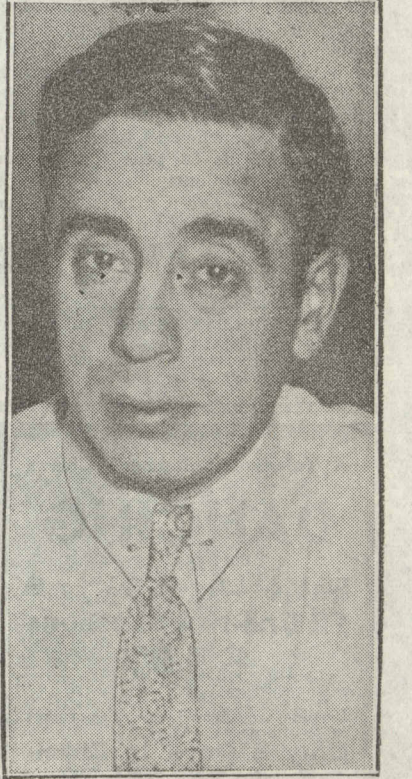
