WINTER HEN FEEDING.

BY FRANK RIDGWAY.

The feed bill for your chickens usually determines whether you are a successful poultryman or not, and is one of the most important items to be considered by those who expect t keep chickens this winter. During the summer months there was plenty of green feed and insects for the flock and the feed bill was greatly reduced, bu the problem is quite different in cold weather. If poultry is fed right dur-ing the winter months it pays, but if fed wrong, it is an expense. Green feed is just as essential in the winter as in the summer, and in order to keep down the heavy expense of buying rains you should begin planning now for the winter supply of vegetables for the flocks.

In gardens where the vegetable crop has been gathered seed may be sown to provide green food for the poultry. If it is not practical for the flock to range on the garden, the young plants can be cut and fed. Vegetable tops parings, and other vegetable refuse that otherwise would be thrown away supply valuable green feed for hens. Lawn clippings are also valuable. They may be fed as soon as cut, or be al lowed to dry or cure, and be stored

in bags for the winter. The clippings keep in good condition. When needed New York exclusively for The CHICAGO they should be soaked for a few minutes in warm water. They can be fed fit, up to date in style, and the easiest alone or mixed with some mash or table scraps.


