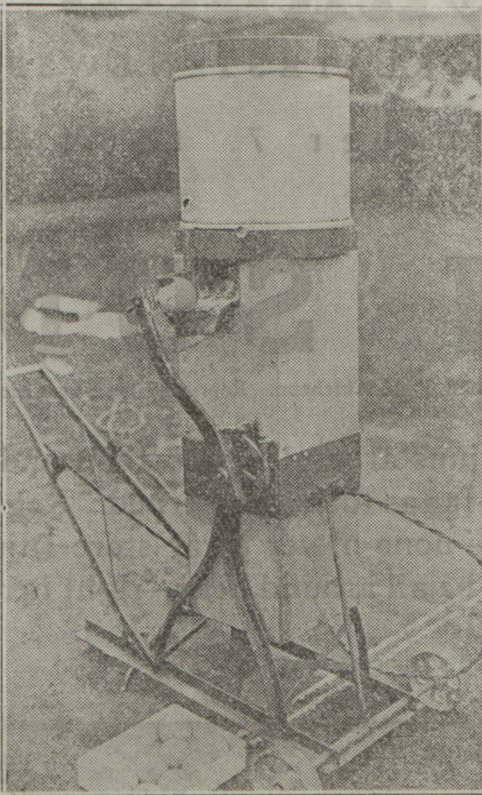
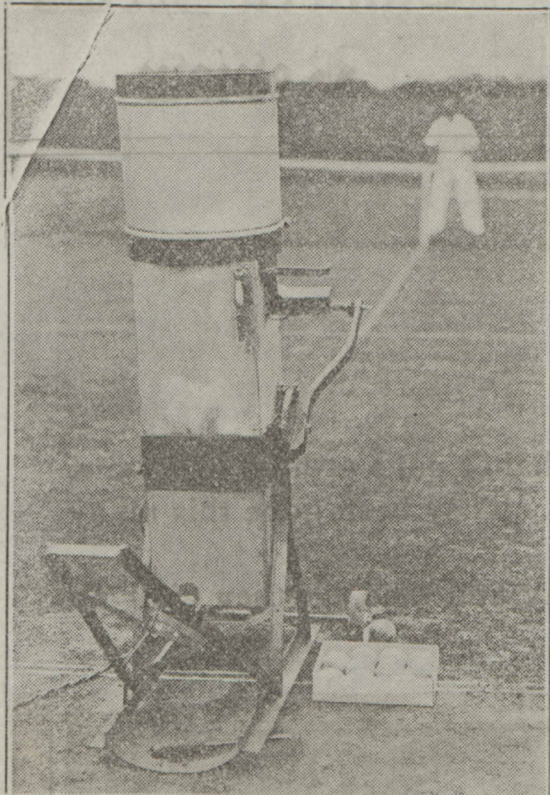


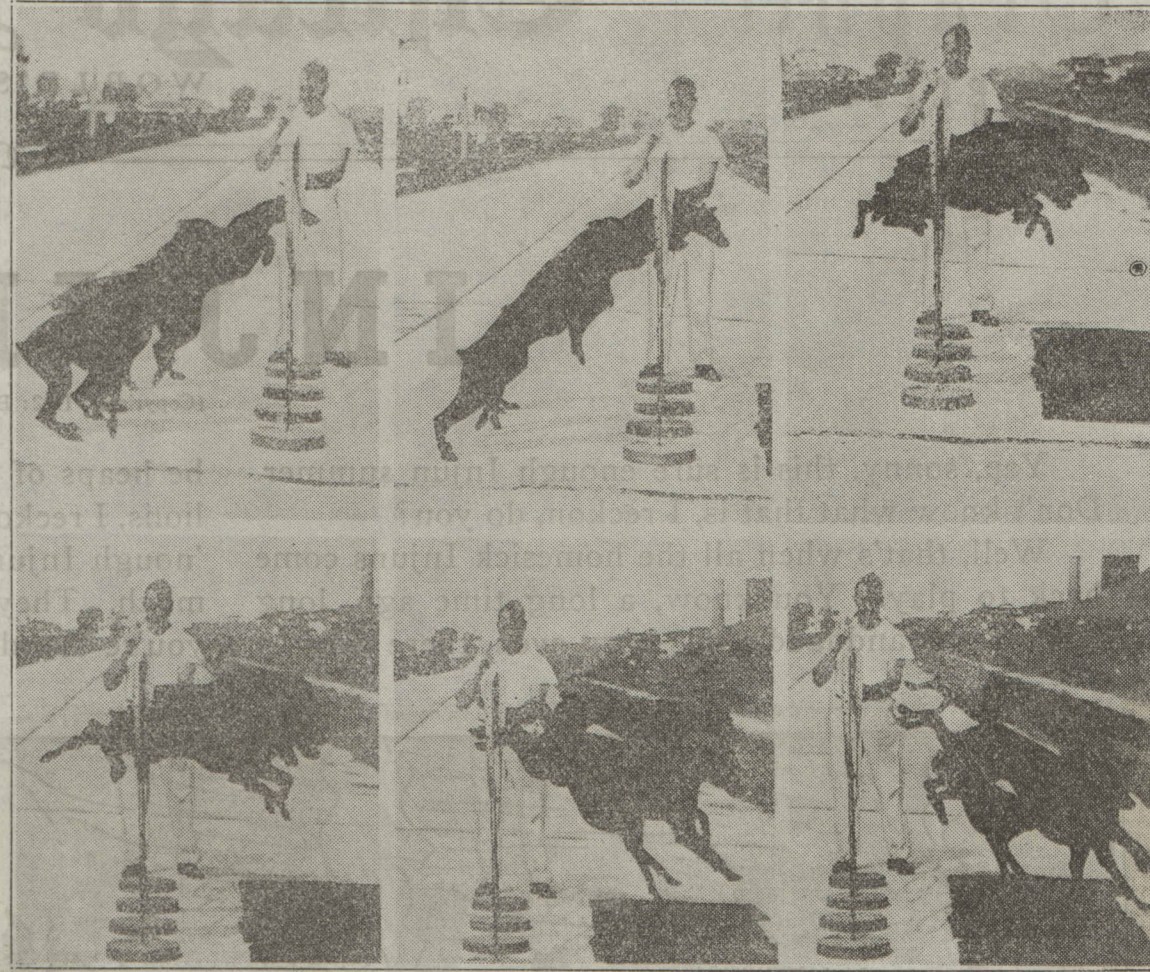
A Machine That Plays Tennis



HERE are three views of a mechanical tennis player invented by Edward Serrano of Forest Hills, L. I., who is shown in the pictures. The machine propels sixty tennis balls over the net. It delivers a serve, a cut, a slice, and a drive. Use of the machine, it is claimed, is a great aid in developing a good tennis stroke. In the center picture

Mr. Serrano is shown inserting balls into the machine. The left-hand picture is a closeup of the robot, and the right-hand photograph shows the machine in action. The machine has become very popular at Forest Hills, which is the national center of tennis activity. Most of the national and international championship matches have been played there.

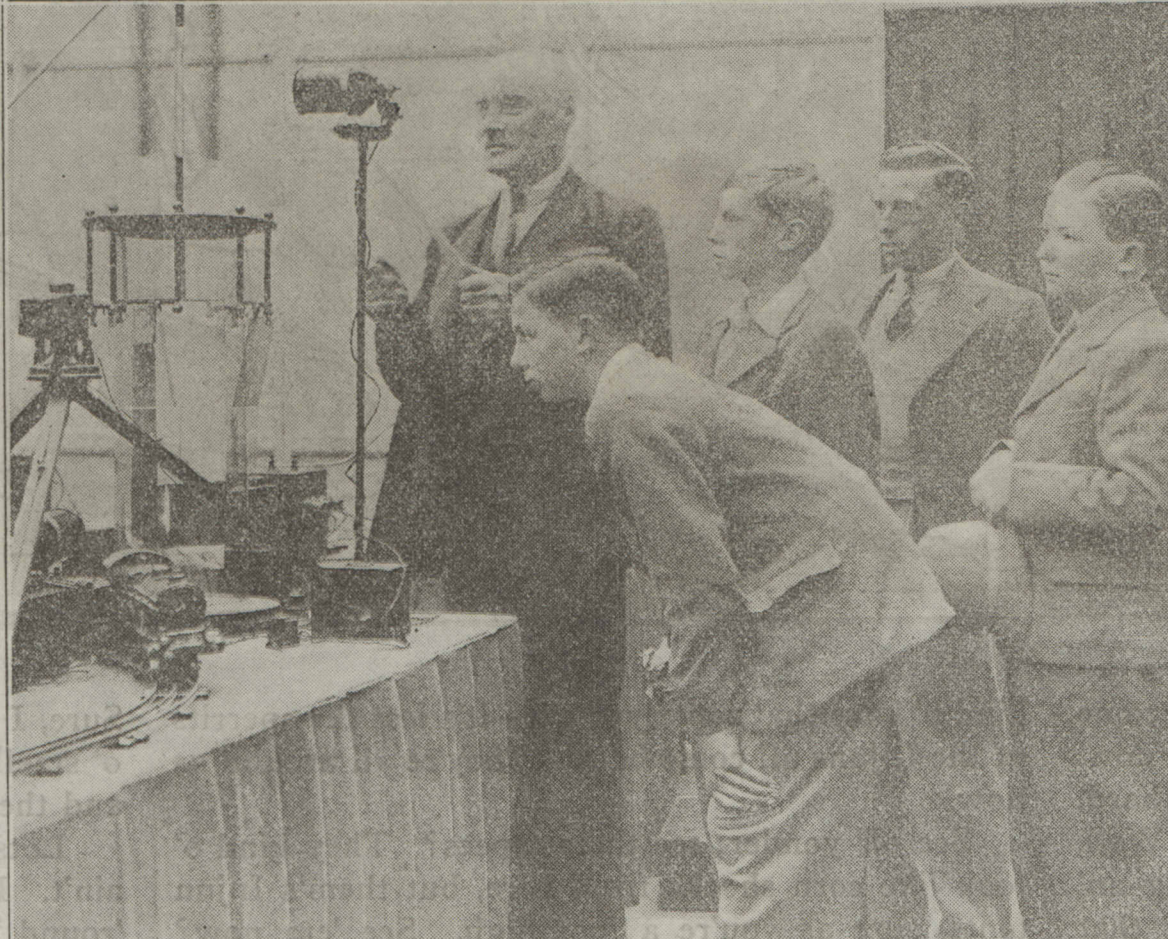

Human Proximity Generates Power

AMONG the newest and strangest of scientific gadgets is the "humanscope," pictured here with the inventor, Maj. Raymond Phillips of London, and a group of interested observers at the Model Engineering exhibition held recently in Horticultural hall, London. The apparatus contains no wires, batteries, nor tubes, but it can be electrically charged through the proximity of a living person. When so charged it can be used, in conjunction with an infra-red ray, to operate a radio transmitter and various

other mechanisms, according to Major Phillips. The inventor, an eminent British mechanical engineer, is shown demonstrating the humanscope to a group of visitors at the exhibition. The demonstration included the charging of the apparatus by one of the onlookers, after which Major Phillips operated a radio transmitter with the power generated. The humanscope was the outstanding example of many new and unusual inventions displayed at the engineering show.

Maori Delicacies



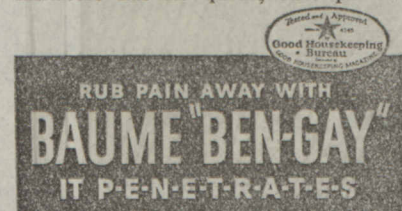
