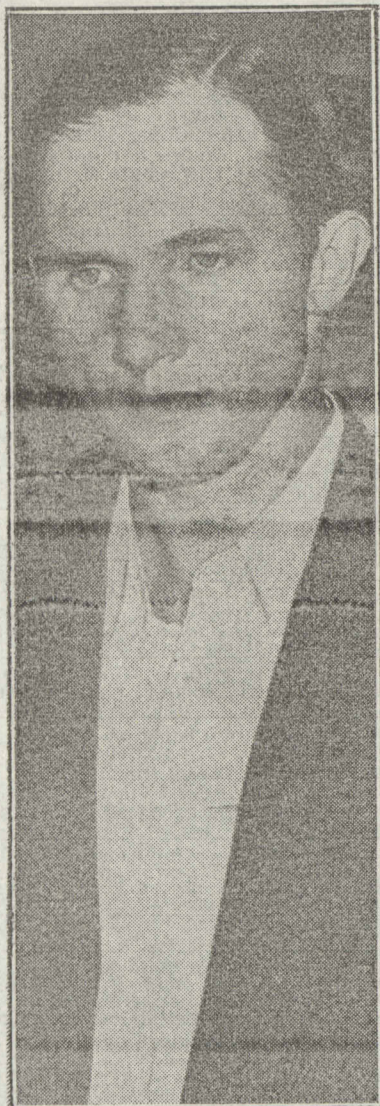


New Jersey Indicts Hauptmann for Murder; Lindbergh Testifies—Gunmen Apply Torch to the Dells

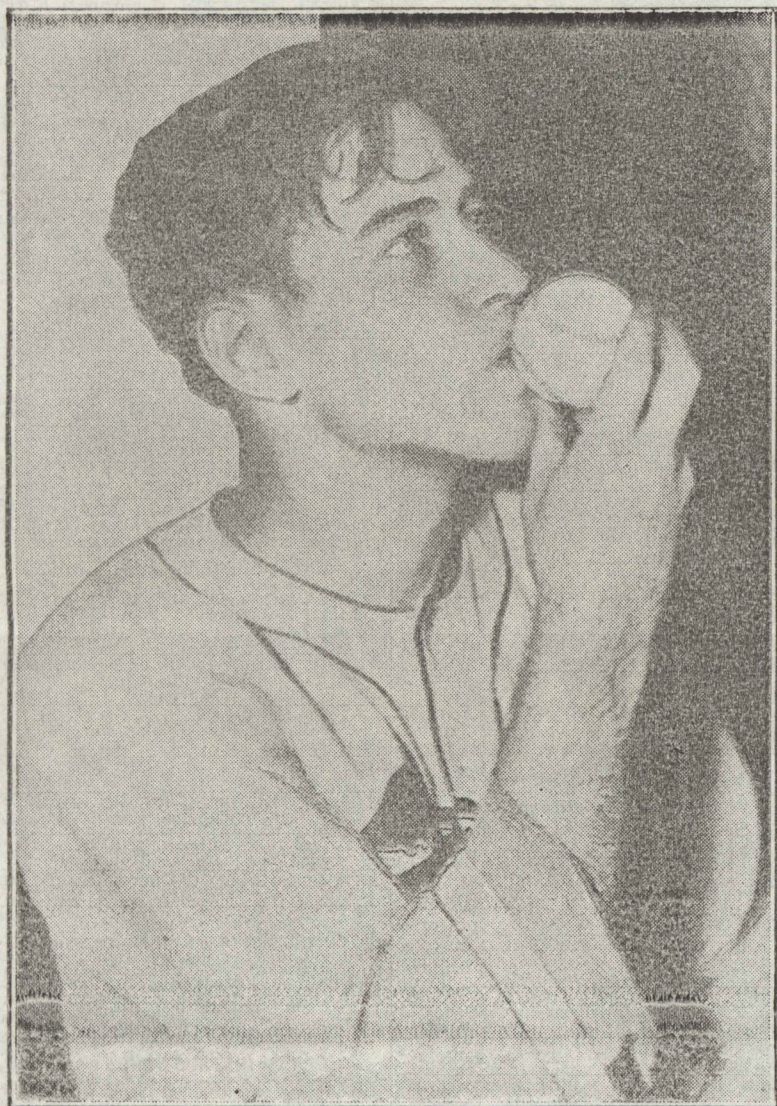
LINDBERGH IDENTIFIES SUSPECT'S VOICE.

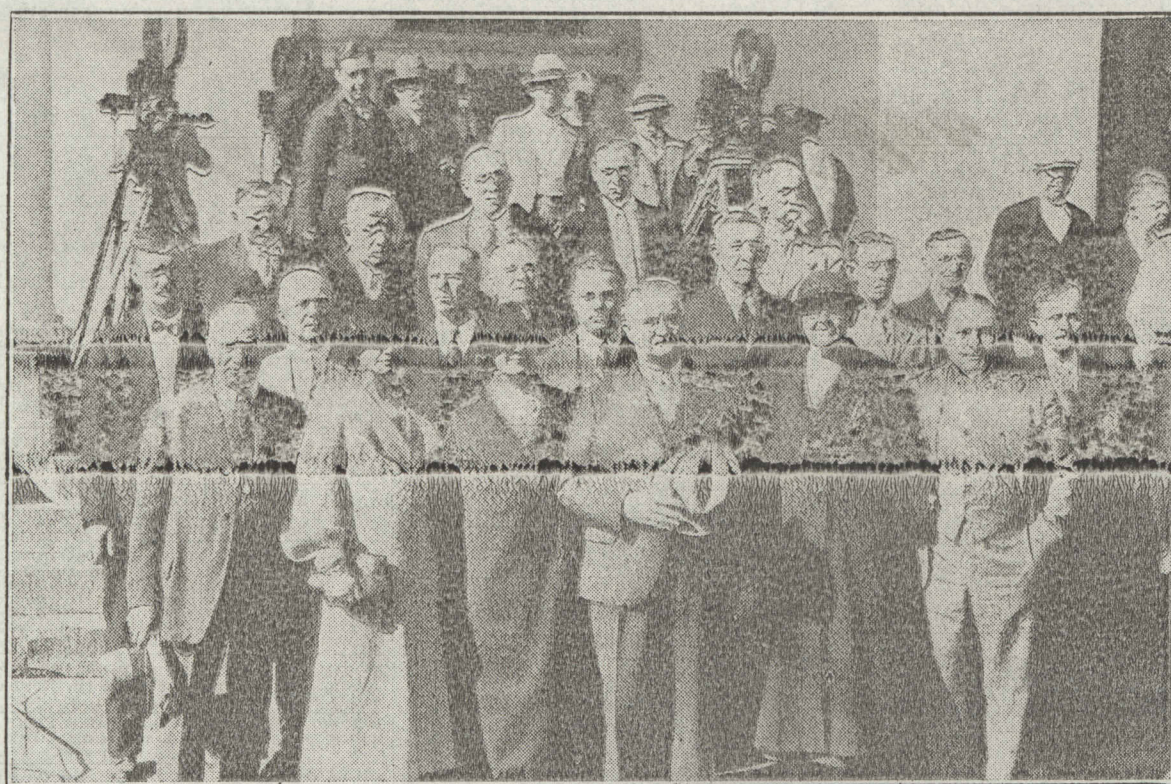

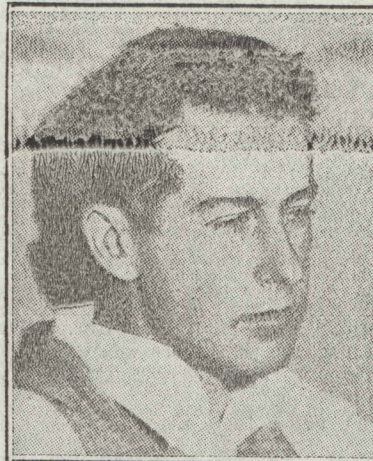
