Here are militant dairymen who are wasting no tears over spilled milk. In fact, as the picture reveals, they are actually spilling the milk themselves. It is their way of protesting against what they consider an unfair price for the fluid product of the dairy. This and other demonstrations of the so-called milk wars are only one phase of the farm strike movement, which, under the more dignified name of farm holiday movement, has kept large sections of rural America in turmoil for more than a year. Spurred on by belligerent leaders who openly criticize the administration's agricultural policies, the farm strikers have resorted to measures that suggest revolt against the NRA and the AAA.
