

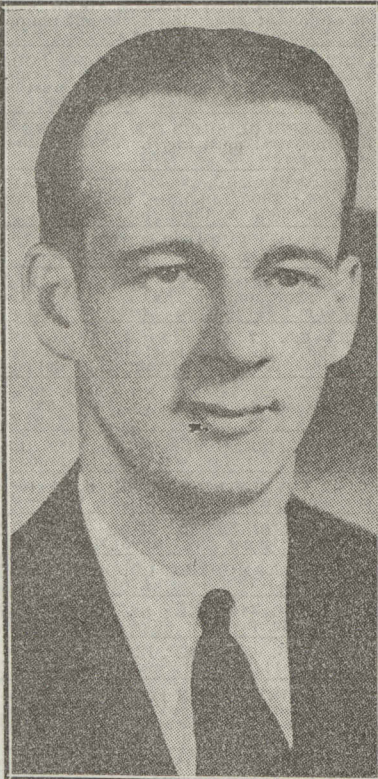
Two Federal Agents Slain in Gun Battle with "Baby Face" Nelson—Desperado Escapes

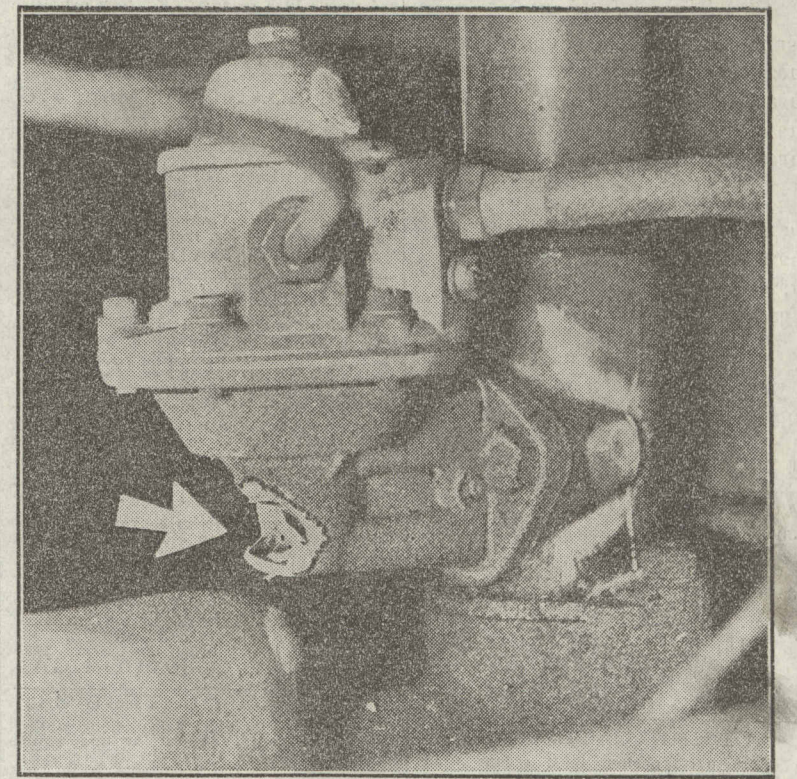
HUNTED AS SLAYER.

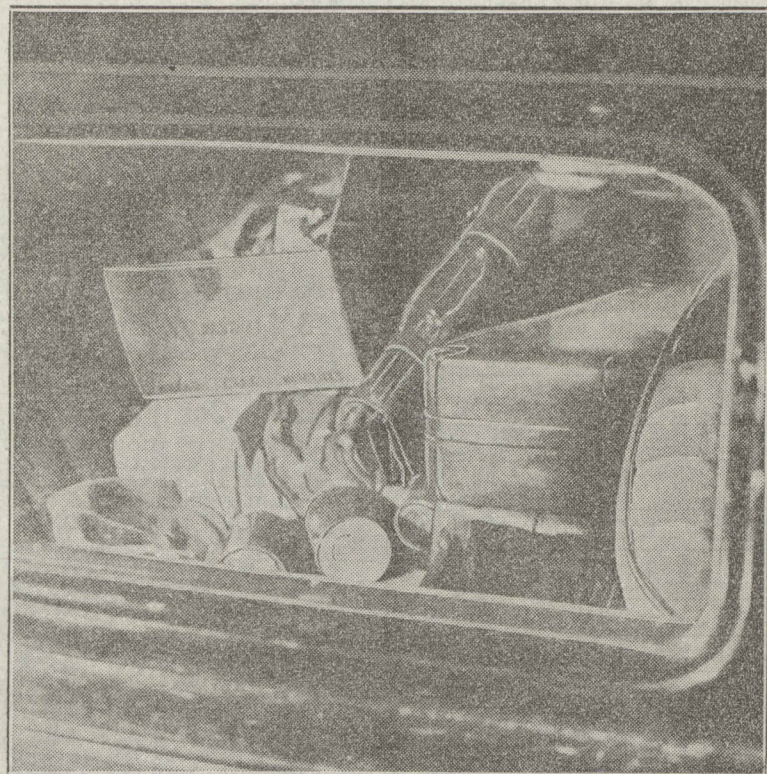
AGENT IS SLAIN. Herman Hollis, age 28, U. S. agents killed in gun battle.

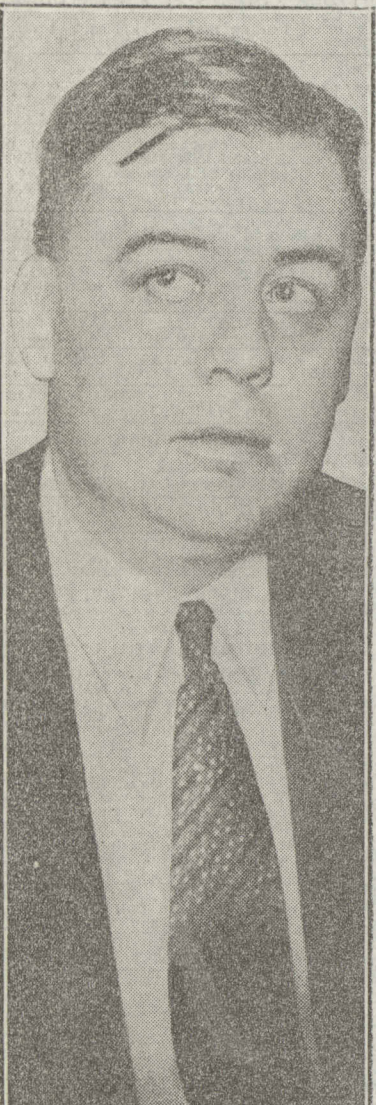

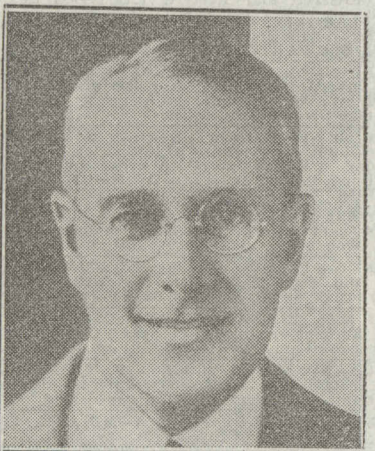

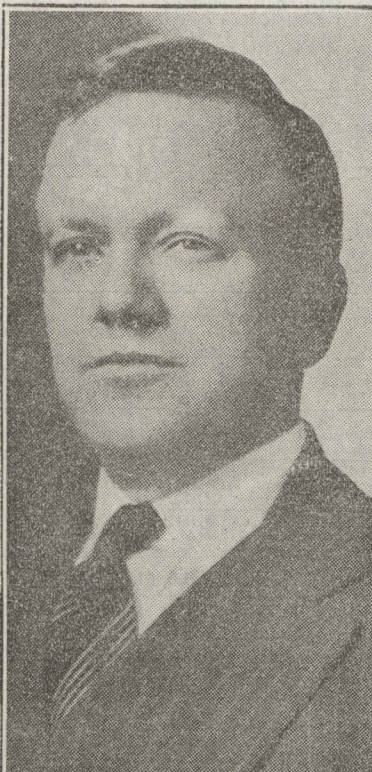
