

JUDGES' OUSTER POSSIBLE IN SPITE OF HORNER STAND

Perry Cites Assembly's Removal Powers.

The legislature has a method for removing judges from office which is not dependent upon Gov. Horner's inclusion of the question in his call for the forthcoming special session of the general assembly, State Representative Joseph Sam Perry (D., Wheaton) said yesterday.

The governor has announced he will not mention impeachment proceedings against Municipal Judges Eugene J. Holland and Eugene L. McGarry in his legislative call. The request that such proceedings be included was made by Richard J. Lyons, a candidate for the Republican nomination for governor.

Representative Perry has made a careful study of the impeachment laws. He attempted to institute impeachment proceedings against Judge Edwin L. Wilson of Joliet in the 1937 legislature and failed by two votes to obtain an investigation of Wilson's protection of slot machines by injunction. Wilson was defeated for reelection last June 5.

Power Vested in Legislature.
"There is a method other than impeachment which the legislature may use to remove unfit judges from office," Perry said. "Little known but powerful, this phase of the law may be resorted to without need for its mention in the call for a special session. My judgment is that the writers of the Illinois constitution were so interested in protecting the integrity of the bench that they inserted this clause so that unfit judges could be removed whenever the legislature is in session."

The clause is contained in paragraph 30 of Article 6 and reads: "The general assembly may, for cause entered on the journals, upon due notice and opportunity of defense, remove from office any judge, upon concurrence of three-fourths of all the members elected of each house."

Extreme Penalties Absent.
Perry explained that this does not carry the extreme penalties of impeachment, which provides that the impeached official must not only be removed from office but also loses honor, profit, or trust. Impeachment requires a mere majority in the house and a two-thirds vote in the senate.

"There would not have to be a formal trial, with the house acting as grand jury and senate acting as trial jury, as in the case of impeachment," Perry said. "And, also, because of the lighter penalty, it might be possible to get the required votes even though they are more than are required for impeachment."

Judge McGarry (not to be confused with Municipal Judge Joseph H. McGarry) recently was freed on charges of malfeasance when Judge Joseph A. Graber in Criminal court ruled that McGarry was not accountable to the courts for judicial actions. Judge Holland has been revealed as a business associate of Edward J. O'Hare, slain front man for the Capone syndicate. Both judges now are presiding in civil courts.

Baltimore Woman Plunges to Death from Hotel Room

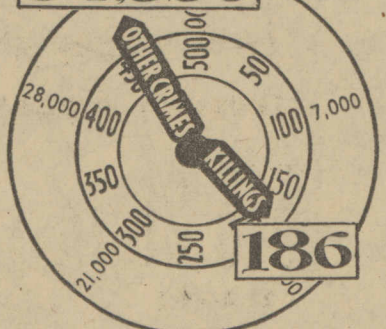

SHOT IN QUARREL OVER BUYING OF WOMAN'S COAT

James Brown, 45 years old, 831 North La Salle street, was shot in the shoulder and arm yesterday during a quarrel with George Stange, 52, of 65 West Delaware place. East Chicago police arrested Stange and said he admitted the shooting.

Police were told the argument began when Brown brought a coat as a gift for Mrs. Clara Sullivan, 39, owner of the house where Stange rooms. Brown had known her five months and Stange for a year and a half. She is separated from her husband.

PRISONER TELLS OF SEEING WOMAN KILLED BY PAL

Chicago Heights and Steger police were cooperating yesterday with authorities in Morris, Ill., in investigating a story told by Richard Law, 32 years old, a truck owner of Morris. He said he had seen James Bell, 37, also a Morris truck owner and the father of seven children, kill Mrs. Julia Onofrio, 37 years old, of Chicago Heights, last Aug. 22. Bell denied any knowledge of the slaying.

Law and Bell were under questioning in Morris in connection with several robberies. When Law told of the killing of Mrs. Onofrio word was sent to Chicago Heights.

Mrs. Onofrio was the mother of three children and the wife of a factory worker. Her body was thrown from an automobile near the Lincolnshire Country club, near Steger. She had been shot three times in the head. Law said he and Bell had picked up a woman in a tavern in Chicago Heights and that Bell tried to rape her and she resisted. Law said the shooting occurred after she had left the automobile and was running away.

Negro Robber Slugs Aged Widow; Steals Her Purse

Mrs. Margaret Lowe, 79 years old, a widow, was struck in the face last night by one of two Negro thieves and robbed of her purse, containing some change, keys, and papers. The assault occurred in front of 2727 Washington boulevard as she was on her way to her home at 3017 Washington boulevard. Mrs. Lowe is the widow of Charles L. Lowe, who retired as auditor of expenditures of the North Western railway in 1929 after 57 years' service.

TAVERN OWNER GETS PRISON IN PATRON'S DEATH

Henry Kettleson, 39 years old, owner of a tavern at 3404 Montrose avenue, was sentenced to 1 to 14 years in Joliet penitentiary yesterday after being found guilty of manslaughter. The charge grew out of the death on Sept. 1 of Michael Holz, 59, a barber.

After sentencing Kettleson, Judge

Michael Feinberg complimented the six women jurors who with six men found Kettleson guilty after an hour's deliberation.

Holz, a tavern patron, died after he fell and struck his head on the sidewalk. Witnesses said Kettleson knocked him down after a quarrel over a pinocchio game. Kettleson testified that Holz slipped. Kettleson's attorney was given 60 days to file an appeal after a motion for a new trial had been denied.

VETERAN CORPS WILL HOLD 21ST REUNION FRIDAY

Hundreds of members and friends of the veteran corps of the old 1st Illinois cavalry and its successor, the 122d field artillery, will attend a reunion party Friday evening in the armory at 234 East Chicago avenue.

It will be the 21st annual reunion of the corps.

Among the speakers will be Adj. Gen. Lawrence V. Regan of Illinois; Brig. Gen. Samuel T. Lawton, commander of the 122d field artillery.

The 1st Illinois cavalry, comprising four troops, was organized in 1891. In 1898 it was expanded to a full regiment of twelve troops and mustered into service in Cuba during the Spanish-American war. In the world war it became the 122d field artillery.
