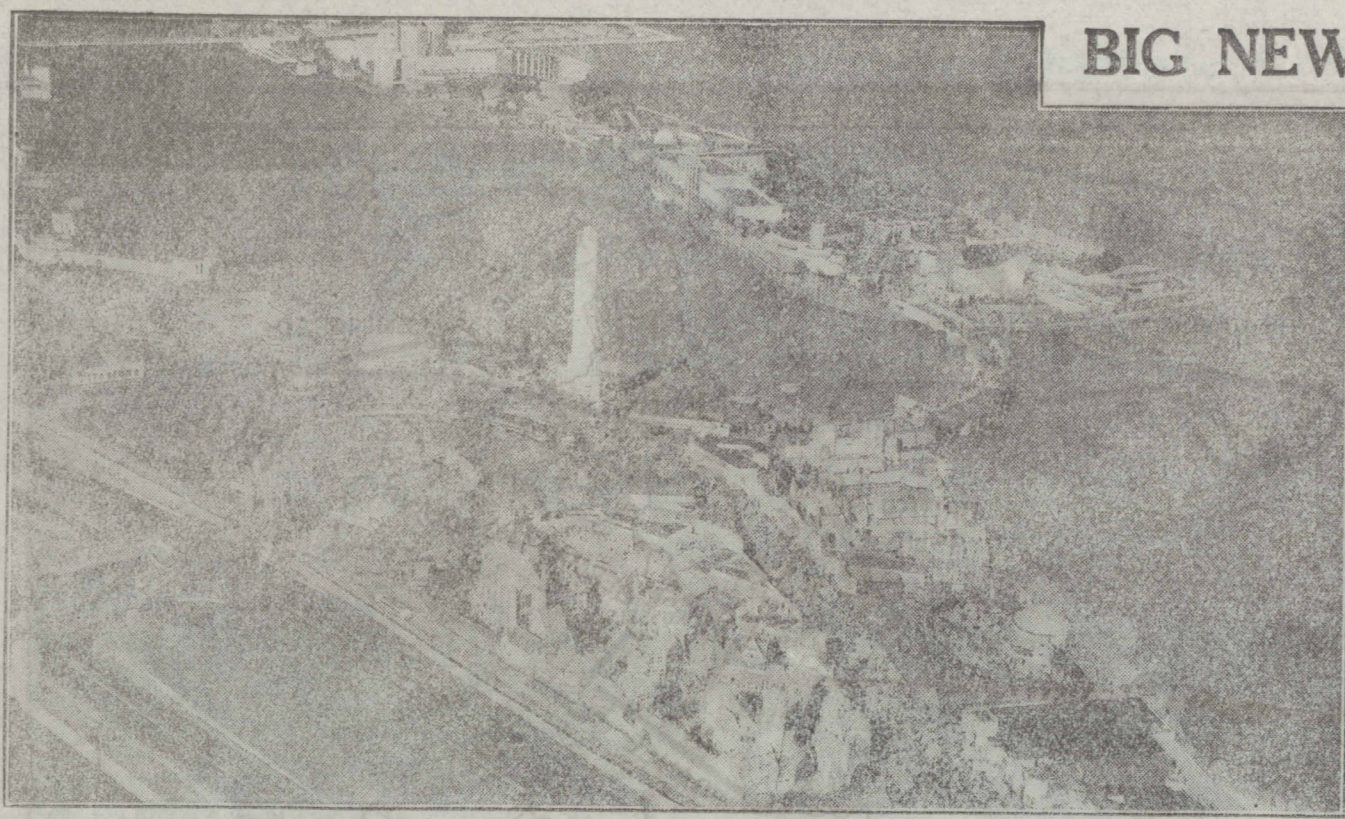


BIG NEWS IN 1933

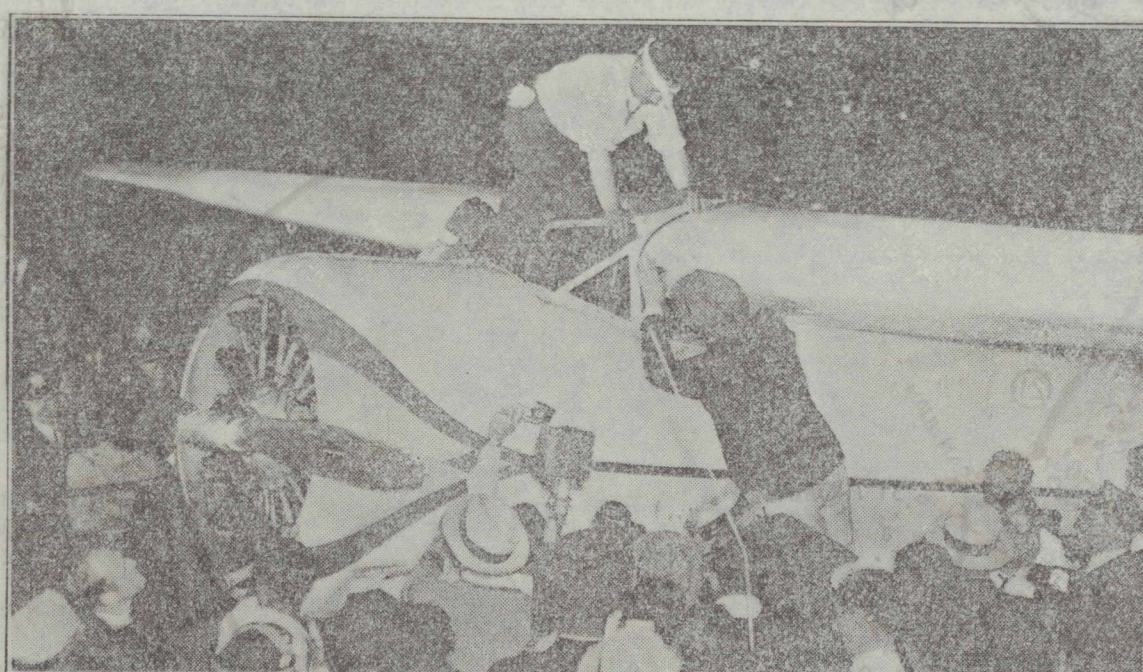

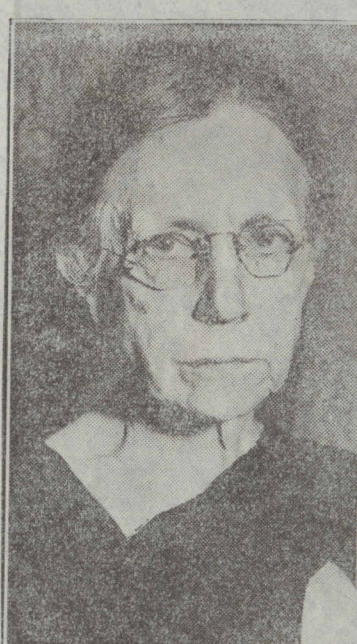

The naval dirigible Astor plunged into the sea off New Jersey, with the loss of 73 lives.



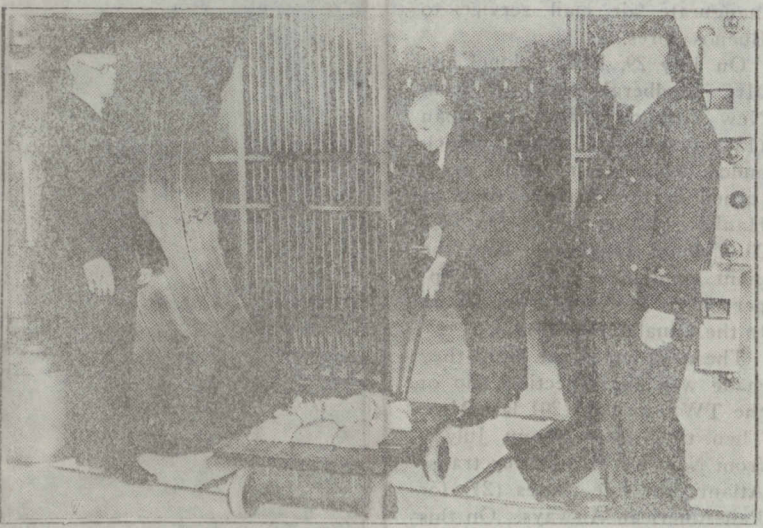
