While everyone wonders how Perry was able to spot Reggie's baseball talent on the basketball court, Perry savs that a lot shows up through basketball.

And the folks who know Reggie best aren't all that surprised. He is called a "natural athlete" who has the speed, muscular ability, brains and determination to excell at one or more of several sports.

Reggie remembers growing up with a father who loved to throw the ball with his son — and Dad Dave says he knew that baseball was where Reggie's talents were.

Some of his personal heroes were basketball stars Julius (Dr. J) Irving and football/baseball's Bo Jackson. And, don't forget his former nickname — Reggie Jackson Ignash — from Little League

lonash has been one of the top athletes to play at Lakers, as shown by his selection to four different All-State teams this year.

He was named to the All-State first team in football as a running back, although he quarterbacked his team to a regional runner-up title. He also was named to the All-State first teams in baseball and track, and to the fifth team in basketball.

In football, he was a threeyear starter, and during his career he played different positions, including quarterback, halfback, defensive linebacker, punter, and kick

In his three year career, he gained over 1,930 yards and scored 15 touchdowns and was the school's leading

scorer. He played basketball for the Lakers for four years, starting as a freshman when he set tounges wagging with his performance in the district championship game

The Lakers were 63-21 in those four years, and won two district and a regional championship. In the regional championship game this winter against a surprising Cass City team, Ignash

scored 33 points, half the

team's total. Ignash was named All-Conerence in baseball the past two years, and he ended this season with 12 homers and a .600 batting average.

Laker Coach Bill McLellan, has known Reggie since his junior high days —and coached him throughout high school in three sports. McLellan says while it's a

surprise to many people that Reggie will be playing baseball professionally (since his high school athletic career was geared mostly towards football and basketball,) he is confident of Reggie's overall athletic ability.

McLellan cites Reggie's "great intensity, strength and competitiveness" which will make him a great base-

McLellan also admits that Reggie's interests were more football and basketball "because those are the sports that get the most recognition

And Reggie himself, now that he is shooting for a professional baseball career, wonders, "I wonder how good I would have been had I taken baseball more seriously when I was young?"

While Reggie's new direction has given him some reason to look back, most of high sights are being set on the future, and the Ignash family is the first to admit that the last two weeks "have been a dream come true."
