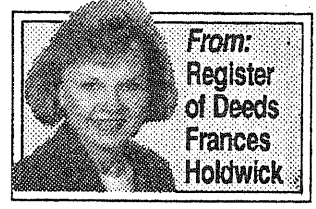

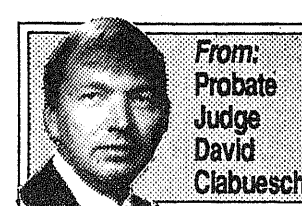

game there, it was quiet and "awe-inspiring," said Kathy. Reggie did a lot of batting and ran the "60," performing very well, according to Coustou.
 Then they sat down and talked contract, and while the Ignash's were advised not to disclose the details, they did say that "Reggie will be well taken care of" financially.

Everyone wonders how Perry was able to spot Reggie's baseball talent on the basketball court, Perry says that a lot shows up through basketball.
 And the folks who know Reggie best aren't all that surprised. He is called a "natural athlete" who has the speed, muscular ability, brains and determination to excel at one or more of several sports.
 Reggie remembers growing up with a father who loved to throw the ball with his son — and Dad Dave says he knew that baseball was where Reggie's talents were.

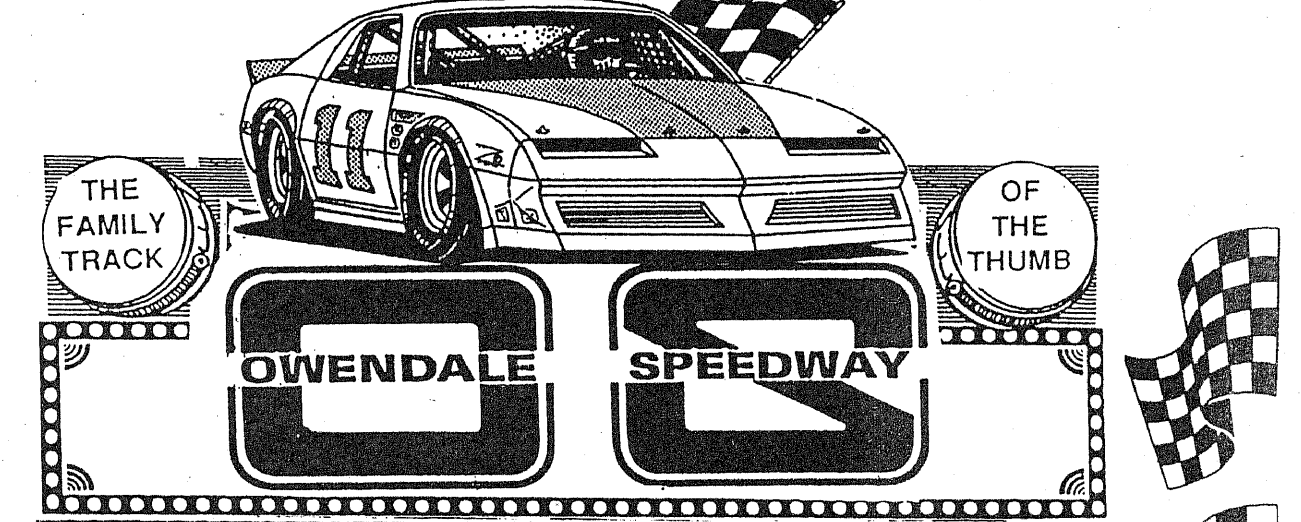
Some of his personal heroes were basketball stars Julius (Dr. J) Irving and football/baseball's Bo Jackson. And, don't forget his former nickname — Reggie Jackson Ignash — from Little League days.
 Ignash has been one of the top athletes to play at Lakers, as shown by his selection to four different All-State teams this year.
 He was named to the All-State first team in football as a running back, although he quarterbacked his team to a regional runner-up title. He also was named to the All-State first teams in baseball and track, and to the fifth team in basketball.
 In football, he was a three-year starter, and during his career he played different positions, including quarterback, halfback, defensive linebacker, punter, and kick return.

In his three year career, he gained over 1,930 yards and scored 15 touchdowns and was the school's leading scorer.
 He played basketball for the Lakers for four years, starting as a freshman when he set tongues wagging with his performance in the district championship game against Harbor Beach.
 McLeLlan cites Reggie's "great intensity, strength and competitiveness" which will make him a great baseball player.
 McLeLlan also admits that Reggie's interests were more football and basketball "because those are the sports that get the most recognition here."

And Reggie himself, now that he is shooting for a professional baseball career, wonders, "I wonder how good I would have been had I taken baseball more seriously when I was young?"
 While Reggie's new direction has given him some reason to look back, most of high sights are being set on the future, and the Ignash family is the first to admit that the last two weeks "have been a dream come true."
 "I'm still waiting to wake up," says Reggie.

DEFINITIONS OF DEATH

Death has become more complicated, rather than less. stem.

Advances in science, medicine and law have added new dimensions to the discussion of that were not there previously.

We can't even agree on a definition of death. Currently it is conceptualized in at least eight different ways.

Medical death: cessation of breathing and heartbeat.

Biological death: cessation of functions of organs and tissues.

Cellular death: cessation of function of all cells.

Cerebral death: cessation of function of the cerebral cortex, the part of our brain responsible for thought and reason.

Brain death: cessation of the functions of the brain, including the midbrain and brain stem.

Spiritual death: departure of the spirit or soul from the body.

Legal death: cessation of the legal rights of personhood, e.g., a person who has been missing for seven years.

"Reversible" death: temporary cessation of heartbeat and respiration that would become permanent without medical intervention.

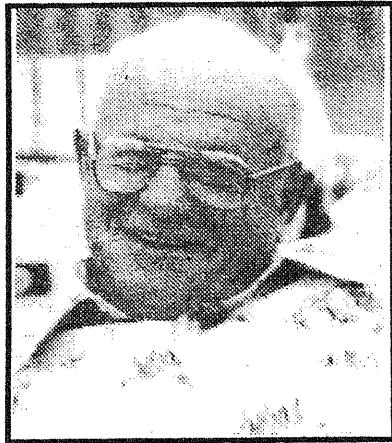

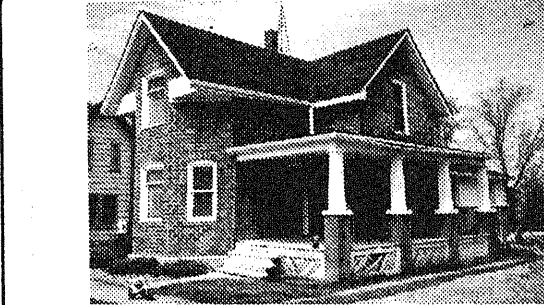

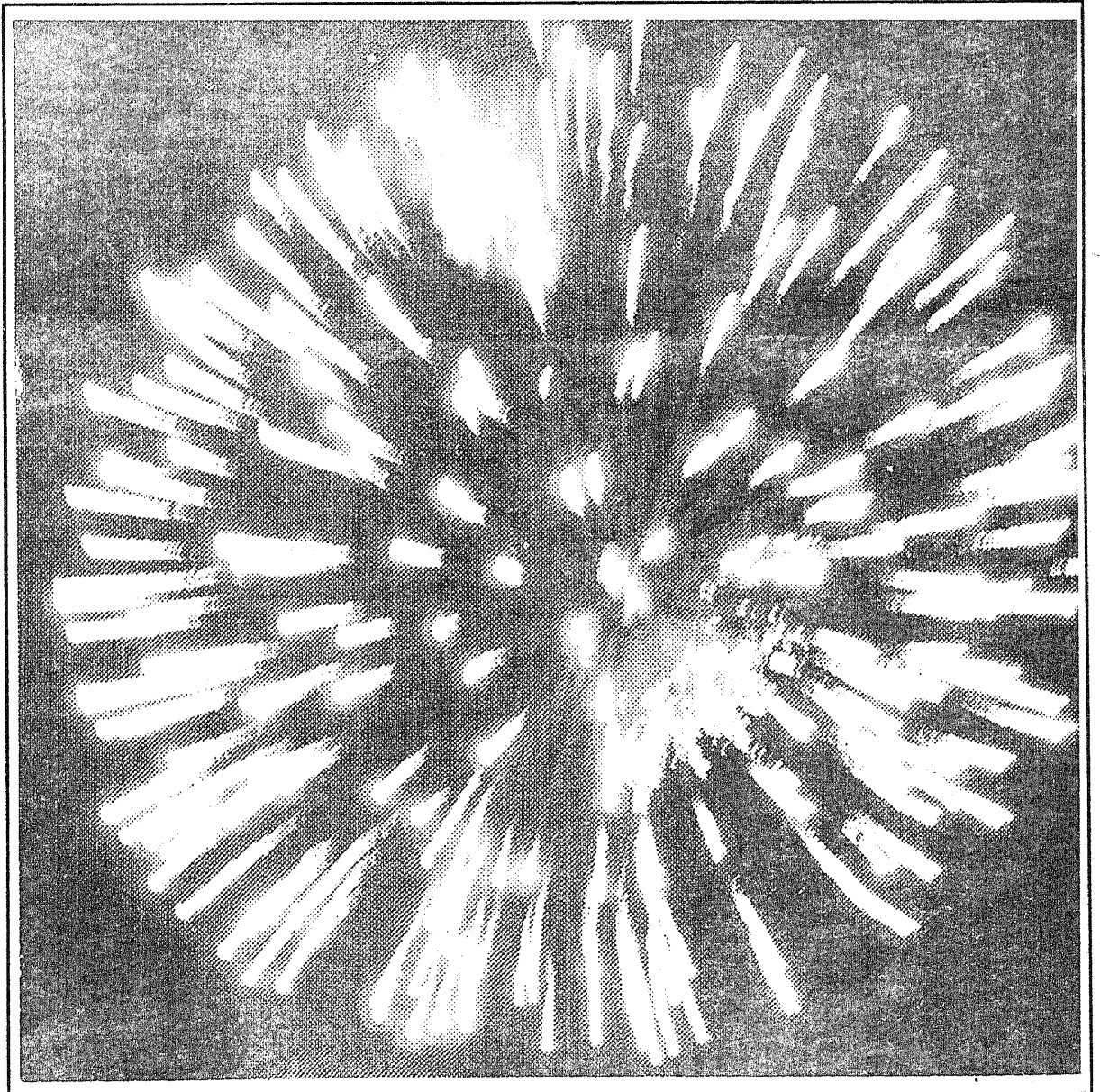
