Aldo Leopold, a man before his time, has sometimes been called the "father of conservation". He was born in 1887, two years after my Dad, and died in 1948 at the age of 61.

He lived in an era when men viewed the land and all it produced as a commodity to be owned and used to the fullest. Aldo thought differently, and now, 40-odd years after his death, conservationists the world over, view his thoughts and writings on the subject as the gospel.

He joined the forest service in 1909, was one of the founders of the Wilderness Society, founded the profession of game management, and died while fighting a brush fire to protect the trees and the land he loved so

much. I was given a copy of his biography recently. A scholarly work that will surely make sense out of the vast array of documents attesting to his life.


