Primitive Paper-Making

In Madagascar a kind of writing paper used by some of the native notables and the fetish priests is made from the bark of a shrub named hahova. The bark floor is bolled and macerated until a thin paste is ob tained. Then a leaf of the plant called ravinia, or traveler's tea, is coated with pulp, formed from a mentionles kind of vice, and over this is spread the hahova paste, on both sides of the leaf. After the coating has thorough with a smooth shell, and the saper is ready for use in writing.
