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PAPER BAG COOKING.

FOR A CHILDREN'S PARTY.

Suppose you try giving the children a paper-bag-cooked party. On such an occasion, the paper bag comes gaily into its kingdom. Not the used bag, but one holding something cooked in another bag or else rigidly arranged about a gift.

For such amusing, spotted bags (usually with gold and silver designs) on the sides, and with their necks with gay ribbon, putting inside a ruff of fringed crepe paper makes the bag a beauty.

Edible, of course, must be bagged very shortly before serving. Prepared tartlets, small pretty fancy cakes, nuts, raisins, bits of crystallized fruit, all make admirable fillings for the bag.

What manner of sweets, fruits, cranberries, nuts, etc., appear must depend upon the season. But never err if the candies are largely home-made and plentifully reinforced with such recesses as a slice of lemon, a slice of orange, a slice of apple, etc.

Put the mince into a bowl, add a very little more butter and a spoonful or so of cream. Bake in a fresh well-greased bag and heat for five minutes. Take up and put in a paper bag.

125,000 AMERICANS GO TO CANADA IN 1911.

THE YEAR 1912 WILL SHOW A GREAT INCREASE.

In a report of the House Committee (Washington) appearing in the "New York Times" of Monday, it is stated that "Canada offers a three-year homestead upon good land, easily reclaimed and cultivated, with six months' free labor, and a grant of 40 acres of land for each year and most recent regulations."
