

London.-The interest of London has no end, for after one has visited all the regular tourist sights, the Abey, the Parliament, the Tower, the British Museum, the National Gallery and St. Paul's, there springs vp countless other places that one should not miss seeing. It is such a vast place that even the average Londoner does not know London. He may know Kensington, Putney and Knightsbridge, and never have been in Elephant of Castle, Wormwood-scrubs or Whitechapel, or vice versa. lt is Picadilly, Oxford, Circus, Trafaigar Square, The Strand, Fleet street and Regent street that everybody knows.

There are two distinct types of Londoners. Pirst, the tall and lank English gentleman who travels in the subway and cabs, and wears gray spats, a high silk hat, a monocle and earries a cane; and, second, there is the Londoner of the underworld which comprises about 2,000,000 people. They are little, deformed, bent creatures, toothless and dirty, who creep out of the alleys and slums by thousands and flood the fashionable streets selling toys and flowers on the sidewalk. They make quite a contrast to the flowers the lovely, frarant English flowers, that they sell. And such prices for flowers! A bunch of violets and lilies-of-the-valley for a penny (two cents), or six glowing jonquils for a penny. These pennies do not go for food and clothing. but for rum and porter at the pub-lic houses that are so plentiful in London.

The slums of London are scattered verywhere. One street may be the most fashionable in London and
