



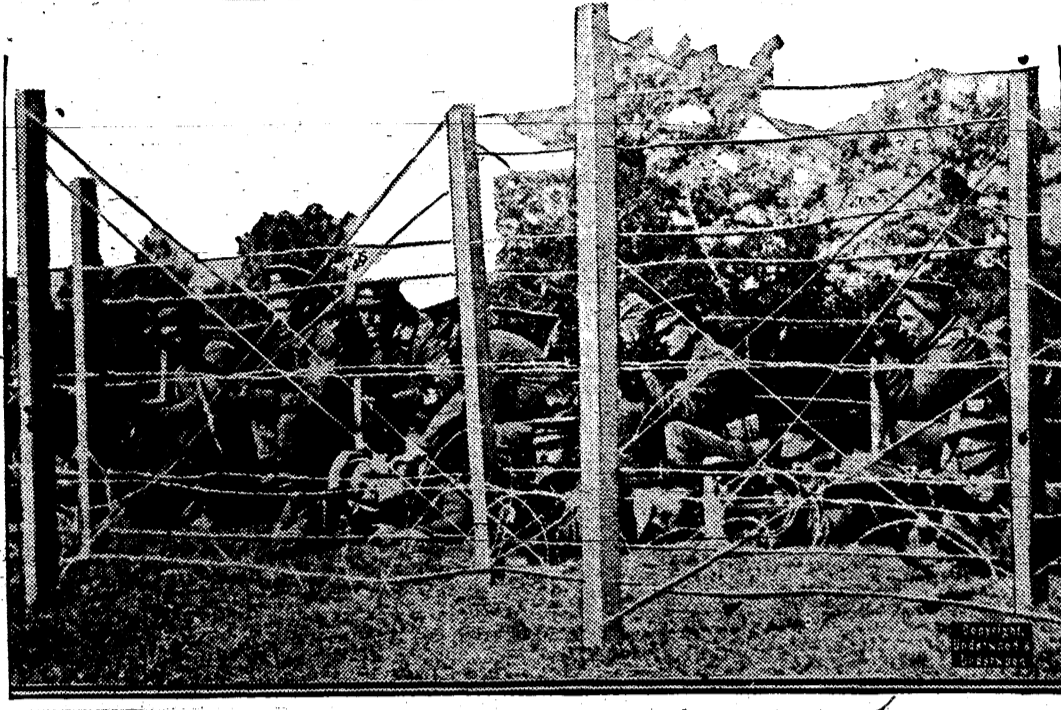

RUSSIAN CLAIMS NOT GREAT

Petrograd Reports Victories, but Admits Austrians Successfully Cover German Retirement. London, Nov. 2.—The Petrograd cor-respondent of Reuter's Telegram com-pany sends the following: "It is semi-officially announced that in the German attack on Bakararzewo on the East Prussian front, which be-gan last Tuesday, several divisions, supported by numerous heavy guns, participated. These included parts of the Ekenisberg and even the Posen garrisons. At several points the dis-tance between the two opposing forces is only 200 to 300 yards.

"Between Gorbatkalin and the Vit-lula the Russians captured, in the four days ending Wednesday last, 82 offi-cers and 8,000 men, belonging chiefly to the Fifth Hungarian corps. The Russians also took 24 maxims. "The Austrians are retreating be-tween the Vitlula and Radom, having separated themselves from the Ger-mans, who are retreating in a more westerly direction, but the Seventh Austrian cavalry division is covering the German retreat."

GENERAL NEWS OF THE WAR

Financial Crisis in Italy Responsible for the Resignation of the Cabinet. Rome, Nov. 2.—All the cabinet min-isters who resigned their portfolios yesterday met today with King Victor Emmanuel and discussed the war sit-uation for about two hours.

Germany Loses Are 420,000. Berlin, via London, Nov. 1.—The Ger-man casualty lists for the last week amount to 62,000. It was an-nounced tonight. The total to date is about 420,000.

Emden in Glorious Feat. London, Oct. 31.—Flying the Japa-nese flag and disguised by the addition of a fourth smokestack, the German cruiser Emden audaciously stole un-der the guns of the fort and entered Georgetown, the harbor of the island of Penang, the British possession in the Straits Settlements, fired torpedoes which destroyed the Russian cruiser Jemtpchug and a French tor-pedo destroyer and escaped through the Straits of Malacca. More than two hundred members of the crews of the warships were killed.

De Wet Granted Armistice?

London, Nov. 1.—The Durban cor-respondent of the Daily Mail says the government at Pretoria has granted General Christian De Wet, the rebel leader, a five days' armistice, presum-ably in order to arrange peace.

GREAT MEETING IS CLOSED

State Teachers Association Holds Largest Convention in Kalamazoo.

Kalamazoo—The State Teachers' as-sociation closed the largest conven-tion it has ever held late Friday night by going on record as favoring equal suffrage and simplified spelling. It also declared opposition to the separa-tion of state and local taxation on the ground that such a plan would endan-ger the primary school funds. The organization of the public school sys-tem into a kindergarten and six ele-mentary grades, and six secondary grades was favored, as was also the continuation of industrial and agricul-tural instruction in the public schools. WHOLE STATE IS QUARANTINED

GOVERNMENT TAKES DRASTIC ACTION TO CHECK EPIDEMIC.

FOUR STATES ARE INCLUDED

Danger From Foot and Mouth Disease So Great That All Shipments From These States Forbidden. Washington—Late Monday after-noon Secretary Houston of the de partment of agriculture, signed an order, quarantining the states of Michi gan, Indiana, Illinois and Pennsylv ania against the shipment of any cat tle, sheep or hogs over their borders. A restraining order has been issued concerning shipments from Ohio.

The drastic step taken resulted from the discovery of herds infected with foot and mouth disease in the first four states named. Until Monday only four counties in Michigan and two counties in Indiana have been under quarantine, but the discovery of the disease in other states convinced the experts in the bureau of animal indus try that the entire states should be placed under quarantine. The reason that Ohio was not quar antined in the order was that no cases of the foot-and-mouth disease have been found to exist in that state, but its proximity to infected areas makes precaution necessary. The quarantine affects not only ship ments of live animals, but prohibits interstate shipment of hides, skins, hoofs, hay, straw and fodder unless thoroughly disinfected.

AN EXPEDITION to Mt. Wilson is no small undertaking. The mountain is 5,837 feet in height according to the geodetic survey. The altitude is 5,000 feet in round numbers as usually given, which is a pardonable exaggeration. The trip involves a climb of 4,000 feet—vertical—which is accomplished in a train of nine miles from the terminus of the Sierra Madre cars of the Pacific Electric system. This is called the Sierra Madre trail and is usually taken by foot passengers or by those who choose to make burro or mule to do the fatiguing work.

But the scenery was magnificently grand. There were fascinating views of Alpine peaks, some of them wooded to the summit with giant pines and spruces, others bastioned by granite crags which pierced the clear blue sky. And a special charm of these beautiful scenes was their endless variety.

At four o'clock when the sun began to throw long shadows from the magnificent peaks across the dark canyon below, one of the party exclaimed: "Why, indeed, is the tower telescope on the distant summit of Mt. Wilson and it was still three miles away. 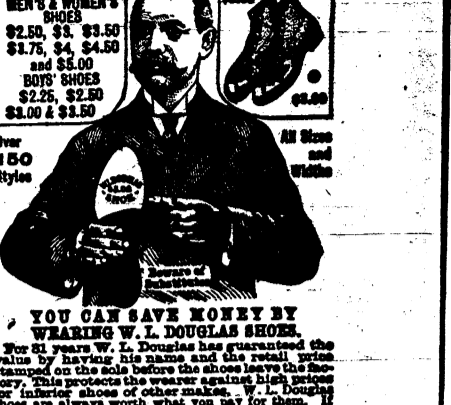

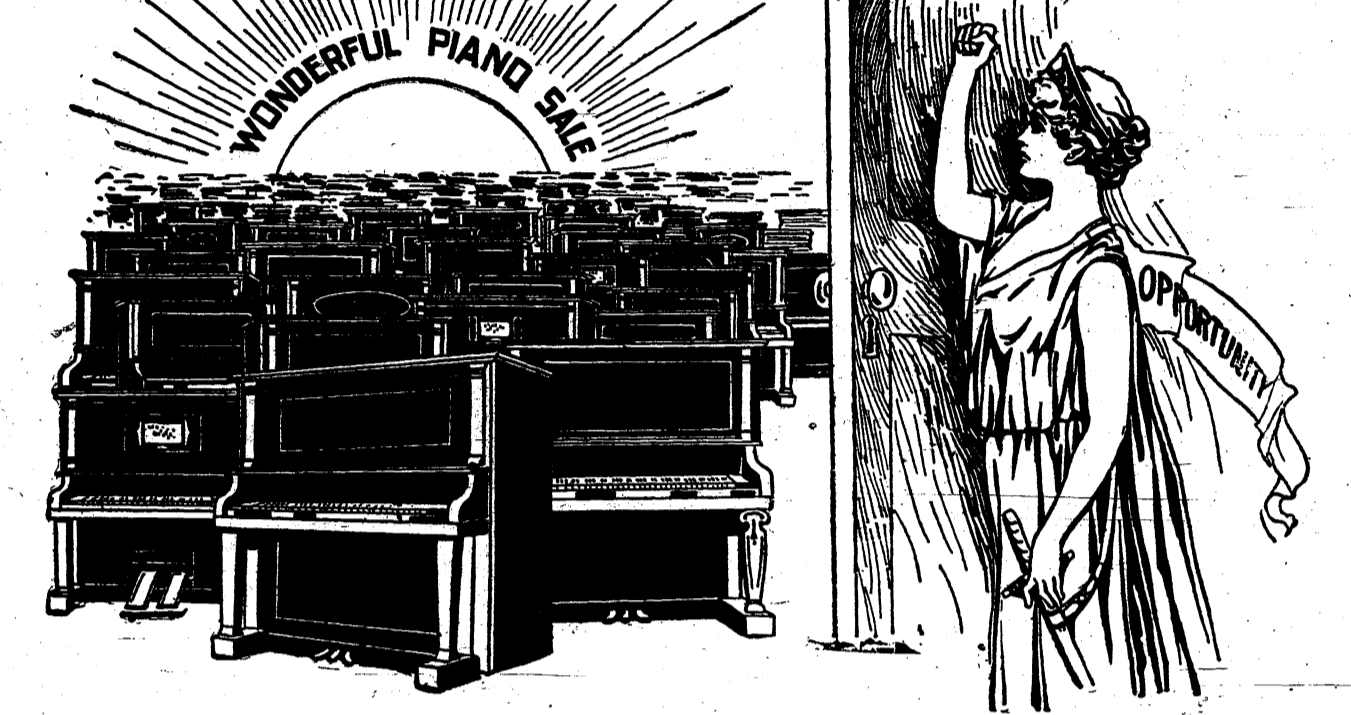
