An overstocked farm is not a profitable one. A farm that is overstocked is one that has more animals of any character than can be properly cared for or kept in good, thrifty, growing condition. Wherever the numbers interfere with the growth or with the attention that should be given them it is overstocked. If the pastures are too small for them or too short, necessitating the nurchase of feed, the profits are cut with a two-edged sword, first because of injury to the thrift and growth of the animals.
