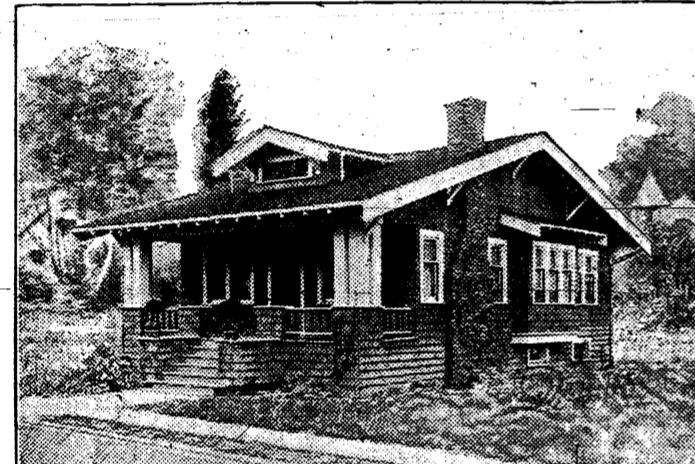

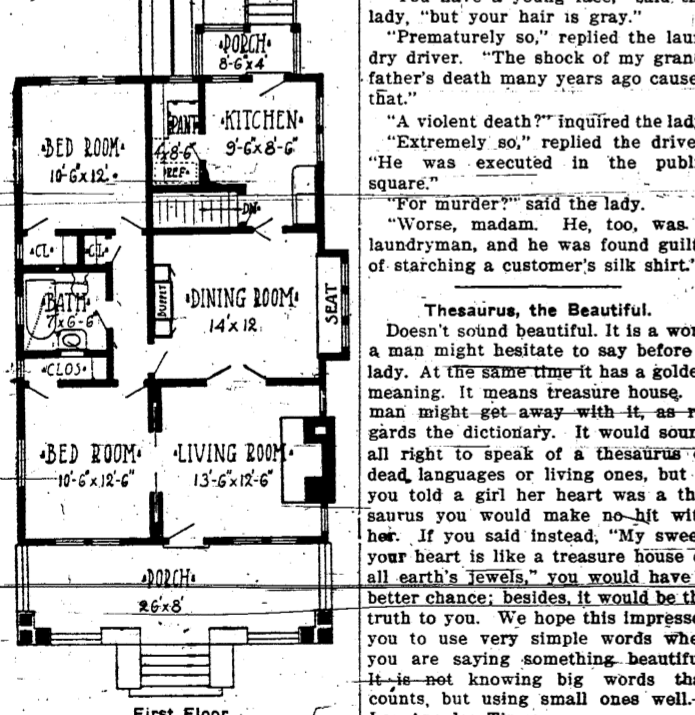

Toronto women have formed a branch association of the Granite Curling club. With the football season over, basketball, boating, wrestling, boxing and swimming will claim attention.

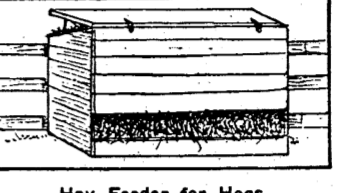

FAIR STOCK

ALFALFA FEEDER FOR SWINE

Box Arranged With Opening in Front Will Keep Hogs Supplied With Hay—Little is Wasted.

A good way to keep the hogs supplied with alfalfa hay is to have a box as shown in the cut on a dry spot just inside the fence, writes L. Olmsted of Emporia, Kan., in Missouri Valley Farmer. Bolt or nail it to the fence to keep the hogs from rooting it about and upsetting it.

SEVERAL DON'TS FOR SWINE

Avoid Scrub Boar and Sows From Twin Litters—Keep Floors, Troughs and Bedding Clean.

- Don't use a scrub boar. Don't select brood sows from "twin" litters. Don't have fat, lazy sows; make them exercise. Keep their appetites well "whetted." Don't feed the brood sow too much corn. Don't forget to provide dry, warm, well ventilated hog houses. The colony house is cheap and efficient in case none other is available. Don't fatten pigs; keep them growing. Don't fail to provide green forage for pigs. Alfalfa, rape, clover or rye make first-class pasture for swine. Don't let pigs drink from mud holes and stagnant pools. Provide pure, clean drinking water for them at all times. Keep floors, troughs and bedding clean. Disinfect occasionally. Dip to prevent lice; vaccinate to prevent cholera; place worm killing mixtures within easy access at all times. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

PROFIT FROM SMALL FLOCK

Wool Buyer Says It Costs Practically Nothing to Keep Animals—Wool Brings Higher Price. "For the encouragement of the farmer who thinks keeping sheep would be a fine thing if he could carry on an extensive business, as is done on the big western ranches, we quote a Texas wool buyer, who says: "It would be a great thing for the country if every farmer owned a small flock of sheep. I buy a great deal of wool at points where there are no ranches near, the products being grown by the farmers who keep small flocks. I have been often told by such farmers that it costs practically nothing to keep sheep on a farm. They require very little feed. They eat the weeds in the fields and at the same time they enrich the land. I find that the owners of small flocks, as a rule, keep a better grade of sheep and the animals are healthier than are those of the large ranchmen, the wools from the farms always classing higher than ranch wools."

LIVE STOCK NOTES

- Don't overfeed at farrowing time. Put a blanket on the driving horse to keep his coat short. Keep the colts fat, and you will have an easy-keeping hardy horse. Never let the young colt get thin or constipated. Keep it growing. Any man can raise a colt, but comparatively few know how to train it. Sheep improve soil fertility. Their manure is rich and uniformly distributed. Sheep are defenseless creatures and are often injured when running with other stock. In the management of breeding swine the health of the animal is the important point. Nowadays farmers are awakening to the fact that it takes strong horses to do good work on the farm. Pigs intended for fattening for the early winter market should be given all they will eat up with a relish morning and evening. Bear in mind in breeding horses that it is just as essential to breed good feet on to them as to get weight and blood in them. A sow that produces and raises to maturity eight good strong pigs twice a year is the most profitable sow to retain on the farm for several years. Always use box stalls whenever practicable. A horse tied in a narrow stall is never quite comfortable and is in more or less danger of being cast.
