The members of the advanced german class are reading Schiller's "Wilhelm Tell."

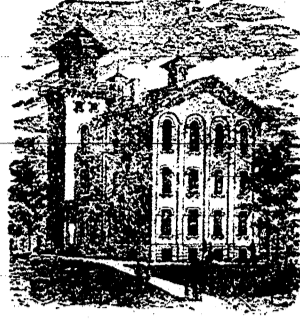
Miss Lydia Grossman has been out of school for a few days, sick with tonsillitis.
