

As the Japanese have now done away with their European officers and Japanese crews, all of whom speak a common language, there is no difficulty for them to comply with all the conditions of the bill and continue their Japanese "The law, therefore, instead of assisting the American ship, adds another

This the Smallest Motor? A correspondent of the Electrical

World writes that he has just completed a motor which weighs only 5.5 grains and is, he believes, the smalles in the world. Its commutator, which sures .045 inch in diameter, is made up of four gold segments insulated from each other with mica. The shaft on which the commutator is mounted is .009 inch in diameter. Fi ber insulation is used between the commutator and the shaft. The tiny armature, .09 inch in diameter, has four pole pieces and is wound with No. 40 silk covered copper wire. The weight of the revolving part is 1.25 grains. Between the armature and the yolk two field coils are provided. The silver brushes measure .012 inch in diameter and are held against the commutator by springs .004 inch in diameter. In over all dimensions the motor measures 19-64 inch long and 11-64 inch high. All visible parts; are finished in Roman gold. When connected to a small flashlight battery the motor runs at a very high speed.
