Cottage That Has Every Requirement for Health and Comfort of Inmates.

PLANNED IN BUNGALOW STYLE

The accompanying perspective and plan show this type of house built for a rather narrow lot, so that the dimensions are somewhat different from the eastern type.

This design shows a very pleasing approach from the street. The broad concrete walk and front steps leading to the wide front door all combine to present a liberal invitation to friends and acquaintances with the suggestion that a sociable talk string hangs clear across the front of the house.

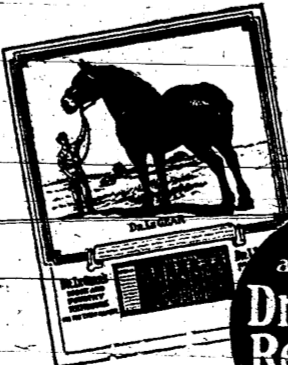
