Spaghetti With Tomato Sauce—
Break a fourth of a pound of spaghetti into inch pieces, drop into saited, boiling water in which there is a small onion. Cook on the back of the stove for an hour; remove the onion and sprinkle with grated cheese after it has been well drained, and serve with the following sauce:

To a half can of tomato add a little parsley, a stalk of celery, three or four cloves, two bay leaves, sait, red pepper, two tablespoonfuls of sugar and a tablespoonful of onion juice. Cook for half sa hour, then strain. Melt three tablespoonfuls of butter, then add the same amount of four; when smooth add the tomato liquid and cook until amouth and thick.






