New Site for County House

In discussing the question of building a new county infirmary the matter of site has been well gone over by the board of supervisors. The present site, while perhaps quite handy on account of the close proximity to Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti, which cities furnish the larger share of inmates, is also accessible to the Michigan Central railway and over a spur track is reached, etc., no doubt at a less cost than could be done by teams. On the other hand to reach the place one must go there by public or private conveyance, while if the site was on the electric line it would be much handier and less expensive. But the greatest objection perhaps to the present site is that the cabins of Ann Arbor do not like to have "a poor house" so near to their palatial residences. They are planning to make the section contiguous to the Huron river valley, the most beautiful of any in Michigan, with magnificent drives on either side of the river, winding in and around the wooded bluffs and "a poor house" located there would be objectionable. We are in favor of improvement and for that reason we would favor changing the site if it can be done at no additional expense. And if the wealthy people want to get rid of it, why don't they offer to buy the land at a price which will give a site along the electric line. We understand that one farm has been offered at \$90 an acre and that is cheap at the present price of farm lands.

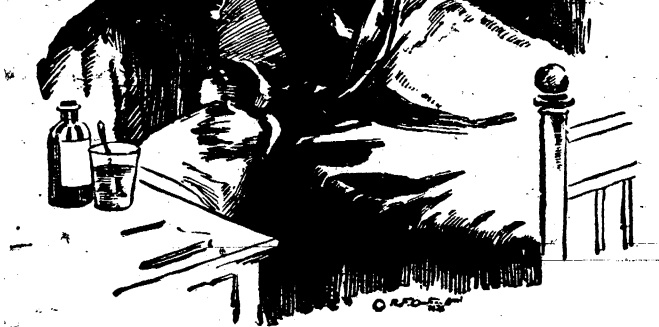

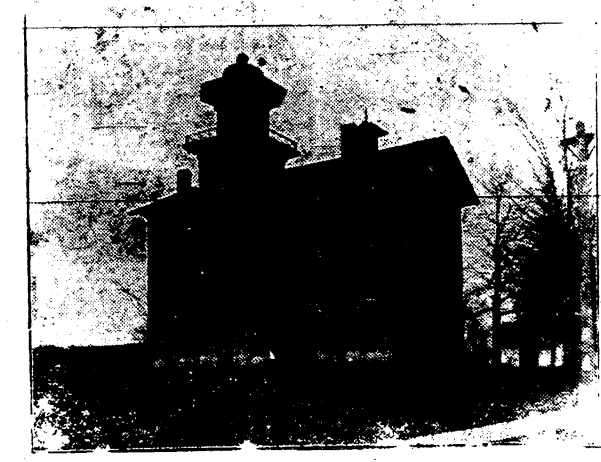
