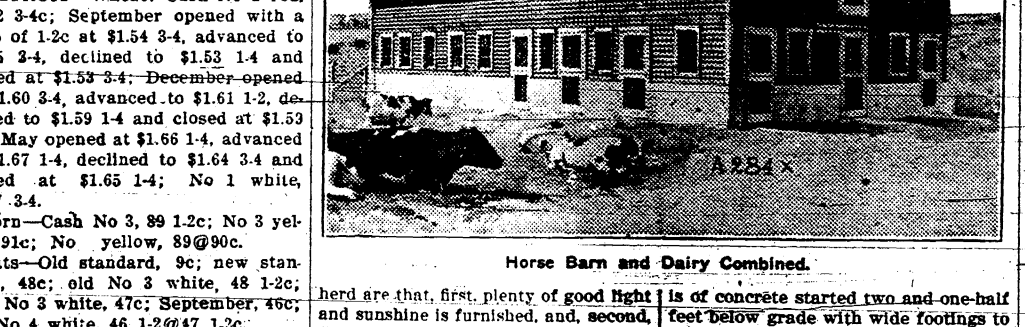

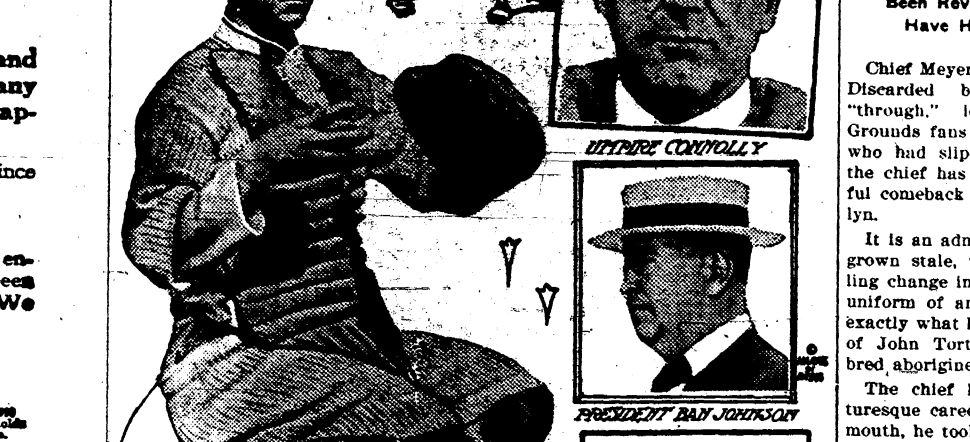

FARM ANIMALS
HOG CURE RECOMMENDED
Device is Paying Preparation and Will Save Trouble—Animals Soon Learn Its Use.

A great many farmers neglect keeping their hogs clean and spritling or dipping them. The hog older not only saves time and trouble, but also saves oil, since the older is washed when the springing is used.

FENCING FOR HOG PASTURES
Material Stump in Profit if Animals Are Confined to Pasture—Make Barrier "Pig-Tight."

The raising of hogs calls for the fencing in of a field or two for hog pastures, for every hog owner knows that there is a very material stump in the profits in pork-growing when the hogs are kept in small runs, obtaining a good crop of given them. Of the three prime essentials in a hog pasture—namely pasture, water supply and fence—the fence is of more importance than most of us realize until a stiff bit of experience has been gained. The fence, of all fences on the farm, needs to be built substantially and "pig-tight."
