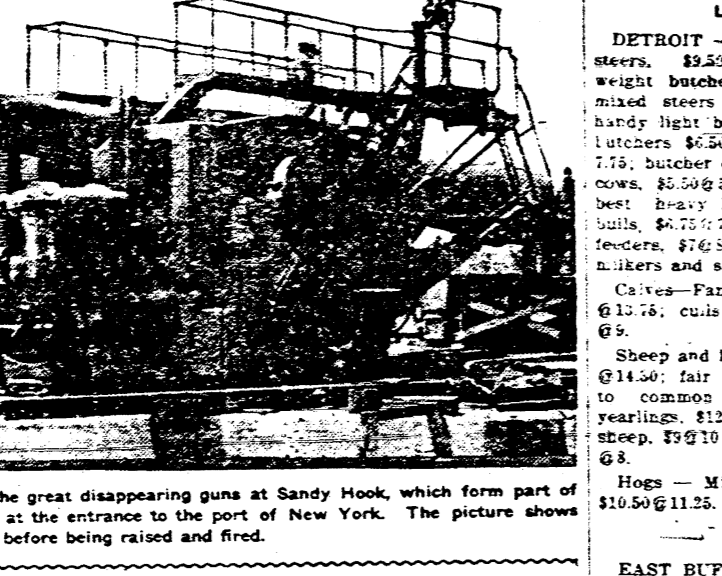

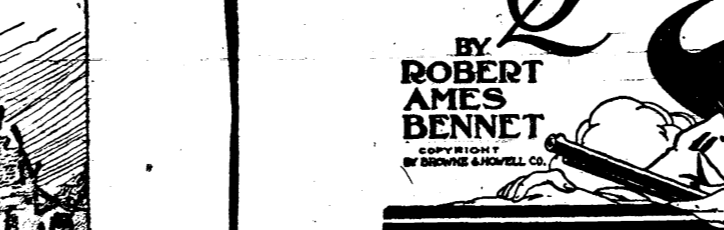
GERMANY MUST FORCE ISSUE

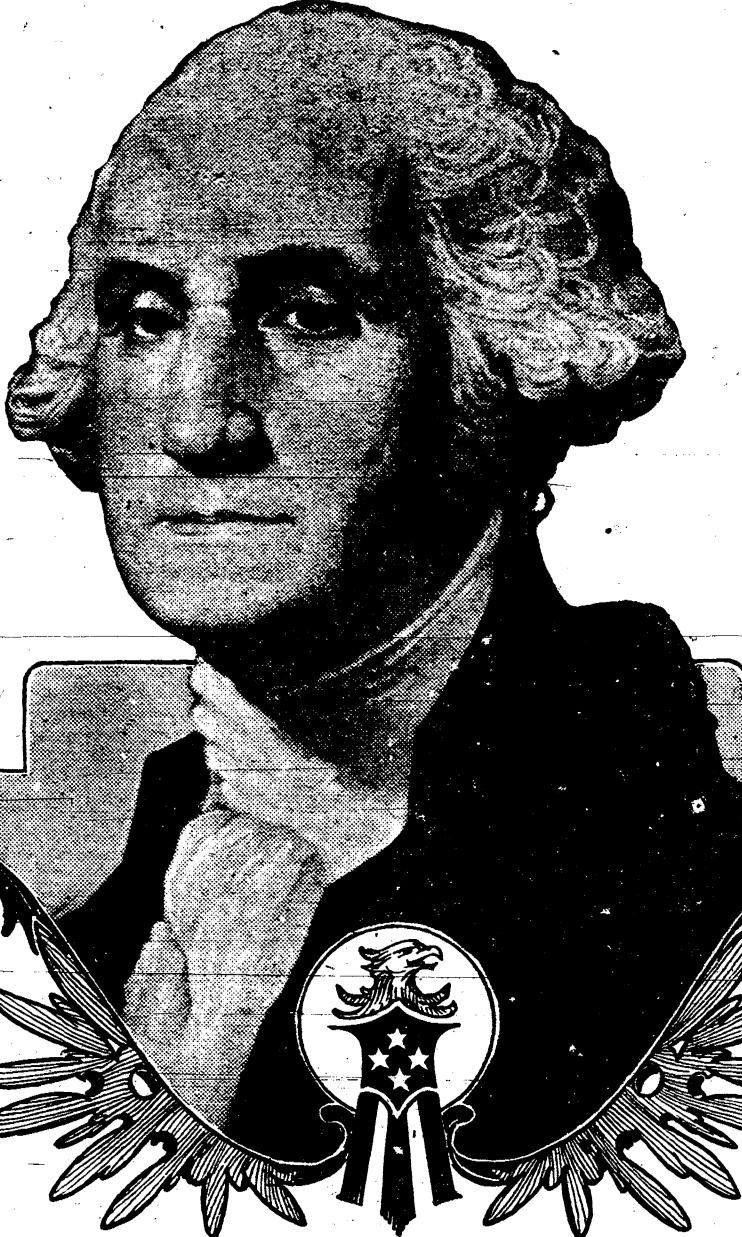
