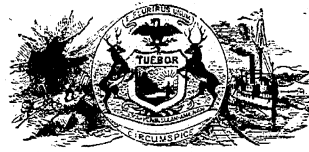

T. N. T.

New Explosive Comparatively Little Known as to Real Facts.

T. N. T. is probably the best advertised explosive in the world today. It was being constantly spoken of during the war. The popular conception of it is that it has enormous power, is very sensitive and has many times the strength of dynamite. As the idea people get of dynamite is that "one teaspoonful will blow up the city hall," T. N. T. may be thought of by many to be in the class of those of which a pinch will blow up a city block.

What is T. N. T.? It is known to the chemist as Trinitrotoluol—sometimes Trinitrotoluene and Trinitromethylbenzene, if you don't care what hard names you call it.

To the ordinary human being, however, it is a yellow-brown powder in appearance not unlike powdered mustard or maple sugar. It is very poisonous and, in process of manufacture, must be handled in such a way as to prevent its absorption through the skin or by inhalation. When the dust or vapor is inhaled or absorbed by the skin, symptoms may be produced, varying from an eruption of the skin to a jaundice, which has often proved fatal in a year in the case of a child in England.

T. N. T. is a white, crystalline solid, a water-white oil-liquid, a by-product from the gas industry, with nitric acid. Although toluol in normal times is not an expensive material, a great deal of nitric acid is used in its conversion into T. N. T. which runs the cost of the finished product up to six or more times the cost of the toluol.

T. N. T. is one of the most stable of all high explosives. It is one of the most difficult to detonate, requiring a blasting cap nearly five times as strong as that which will fire straight dynamite. It is a very powerful explosive, but not so strong as popularly supposed.

PROGRAM COMPLETE FOR MEMORIAL DAY

Soldiers and Sailors Who Have Answered Taps Will Be Fittingly Remembered.

Arrangements are practically complete for observing Decoration Day here next week Friday, May 30, and all hope that the weather will be such that the program may be carried out at Oak Grove cemetery.

It was hoped that the soldiers and sailors of the late war, who have returned home, might take part in the appeal of the chairman as yet.

The senior class and high school boys and girls will assist in decorating the graves. Supt. Andrews and assistants have prepared appropriate exercises to be held in front of the public vault at Oak Grove.

As heretofore, owners of automobiles are solicited to assist in carrying the G. A. R., W. R. C. and school children to and from the cemetery. Those who can provide flowers to be used for decorating the soldiers' graves are asked to bring them to the post rooms Thursday afternoon or early Friday morning.

The G. A. R. will meet at the post room at 8:30 a. m. and hold part of their services there, also strew flowers on the river in honor of the sailors.

Their friends to the cemetery before going to the school building, and should be at the latter place promptly at 9 o'clock. On the way to the cemetery all autos will stop when reaching The Enterprise office where the G. A. R. and W. R. C. will be in waiting, also to pick up the baskets of flowers. Autos will drive up the center avenue at Oak Grove and unload so that people may more easily scatter throughout the grounds and witness the decorating of graves.

There will be seven G. A. R. members detailed, each to oversee the decorating of a certain number of graves, and accompanying them will be a high school girl carrying a flag, which she will hold over each grave
