me opinion, the situation n the Near East is-the most lesperate in the world."
Mr. Hoover has sent a letter to Cleveland H. Dodge, treasurer ut Near East Lelief, 1 Madison avenue, New York, in which he says:
"In accepting your invitation to become a member of the Li cutive Committee of the Near East committee, I do so duty torards one of the most difficult situations in Europe Until some political settlement can be obtained for the Near East and some government established in responsibility for the care and epatriation of the Armenian population in the Caucasus, this mass of people must live sheerly by the charity of the United States. There are in the Caucasus approximately 1,800 , 000 Armenians, of whom 800,000 are entirely- destitute-refugees from Turkey-and amongst then a tremendous mass of children. upon the members of the committee and their supporters the critical necessity of concentrating every possible effort to support Colonel Haskell's administration in the amounts that he requires; otherwise we shall witness one of the greatest tragedies of the entire mar.
