the state. He purchased the Anderson ranch of 2,360 acres, near Prescott, and proposed to expand his interests in that region on a scale heretofore not attempted by anyone.

By making use of other tracts which he will lease, Mr. Burtless intends to have flocks of 15,000 to 18.000 sheep next summer, and he intends hereafter to winter about 10.000 ewes. He reports that 200 acres of land producing alfalfa and root crops will provide winter feeding for all the sheep he can handle. Last fall he shipped an entire trainload of "feeders." Despite the continued cold of the winter just passed about 35,000 ring-necked pheasants thrived in the forests, cut-over and otherwise in the northern half of the lower peninsula. Some few birds have pulled through the winter north of the Straits, but

some rew irrds have pulled through the winter north of the Straits, but they are comparatively few.

With this start, Game Warden J. Baird hopes to increase the pheasants in the state until the spring of 1921, when it is hoped to have 100,000 of them. Then the legislature may be persuaded to let hunters have a crack at the cock birds, with the daily or season bag so limited that serious inroads will hardly be possible. By the fall of 1921 Michigan hunters should be hunting the new game.

The hatchery is near Mason and 90,000 pheasant egs were sent out last spring for hatching by farmers and others. Several flocks of birds have been released and watched by L. Whitney Watkins and others in this section and we hope the experiment has proven satisfactory.

MICHIGAN FOR SHEEP

Ranchers Find Michiga Cut-Over Lands Ideal for Big Flocks.

Experiments made by several big western stockmen who had experienced severe losses by drought'in Arizona and other states, to see what Michigan offered as a stock ranging state seems to prove that the cut-over land in the upper portion of the lower peninsula and in the upper peninsula are of vast benefit and a source of profit to stock raisers.

L. H. Scobey, who runs a ranch in New Mexico, is among the pioneers in the scheme of bringing stock from the drought stricken west to the cut-over lands of Michigan, which furnish an abundance of rich green grass and plenty of pure water. He has 600 acres in Mason county where convenient railroad facilities are a valued asset. He says that he believes he has found one of the best sheep ranches to be had. The high land will provide early pasturage in the spring, the low lands will support focks during the summer seals on of drought, should there be one.
