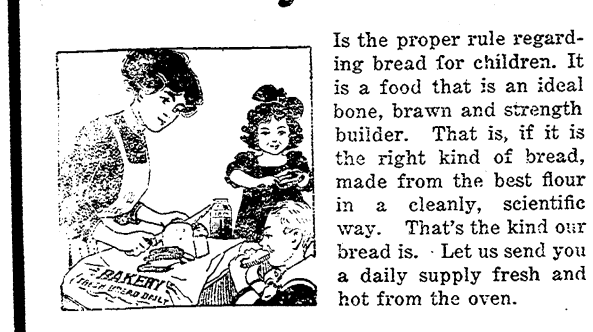

DEBORAH AND BARAK DELIVER ISRAEL

LESSON TEXT—Judges 4:4-5:31. GOLDEN TEXT—God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.—Ps. 46:1.

ADDITIONAL MATERIAL—Judges 4:1-3; Heb. 11:32, 33. PRIMARY TOPIC—A Brave Woman Helping a General. JUNIOR TOPIC—A Story of a Hero and a Heroine. INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOPIC—Fighting on God's Side. YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOPIC—The Services of Women in National Leadership.

The book of Judges covers the period from the conquest of Canaan and death of Joshua to the judgeship of Samuel. While Joshua and the elders of his generation lived the people in God in obedience to his Word, but the very next generation went into apostasy. Their declension may be accounted for as follows:

1. Failure to drive the Canaanites from their midst. They had gained the victory over them, but failing to exterminate them, their presence became a constant source of temptation. Their mistaken tolerance became their undoing.
2. Their amalgamation with the Canaanites. Their close proximity to the people had its leavening effect, for they soon intermarried with the heathen. Tolerance with the enemy is closely followed by union therewith, and quick disaster comes in the wake of such union.
3. Idolatry. Intermarriage with the heathen was soon followed by the worship of the heathen gods. Thus Israel's power was gradually weakened, so that instead of being conquerors they became the conquered. God's people lose their power over the world as soon as they make alliance with it.

1. The sin of the people (v. 6-13).
 2. God's judgment for their sin (vv. 14, 15).
 3. Repentance of the people (3:9).
 4. God's deliverance at the hands of the judges (v. 16-19).

SHORT CIRCUITS CAUSE TROUBLE
Average Automobile Driver Knows Little or Nothing About Electrical System.

USUALLY AWAITS CALAMITY

Operator Should Familiarize Himself With Wiring on His Car—Instruction Book Will Help Solve Puzzling Situations.

"The average driver knows nothing about electricity, as applied to the automobile, and so is unable to tell when the ignition system is functioning properly," says a well-known motorcar authority.

"He is afraid to experiment and believes in letting things alone until something happens. He then looks over the system for the first time, and, of course, does not know whether the wiring is right or not. I have repeatedly pointed out cases of worn insulation among other troubles about which the operator seemed entirely lost. In one case the spark was jumping freely from a distributor wire to a piece of metal nearby, and he pointed to it as evidence that he had a good spark—evidently accepting it as a matter of course that the spark should jump where it did.

Watch Chaffing Wires. "Even if the operator understands nothing of the nature of his ignition system he should, at least, familiarize himself with the positions of the various wires, their colors and general condition. Here the instruction book will be a great help. Watch particularly for cases where one wire chafes against another or some piece of metal. Such places should be protected with electric tape, or at least separated so that no short circuit may occur. But the high tension or secondary wires may develop a short circuit where they are not intended to be connected."

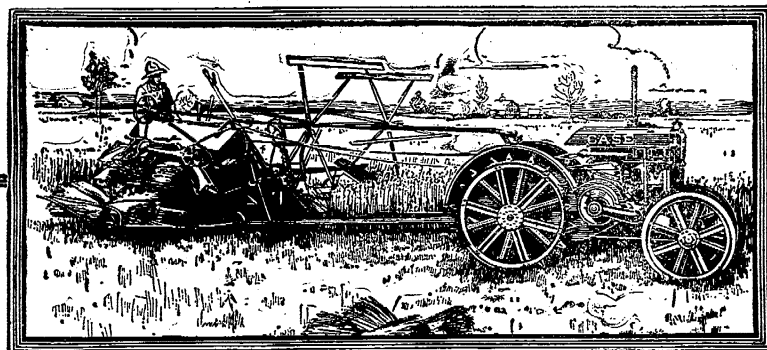
