Electricity to Locate Metal. The idea of using current transmitted through the earth as a means of locating metal ores is familiar, the belief being that the greater conductivity of these metallic regions can be clearly indicated, and the area mapped out, says the Scientific American. The location of oil deposits, which according to the Electrical Review is now being investigated electrically, presents a converse problem. In this case the insulating properties of the oil diminish the current, and oil-bearing regions are detected accordingly. In view of the great depth to which it is often necessary to bore for oil—oil that only exists simultaneously with an almost oil-free area above—the method would seem to have limitations, but it has doubtless possibilities in dealing with surface oil areas.

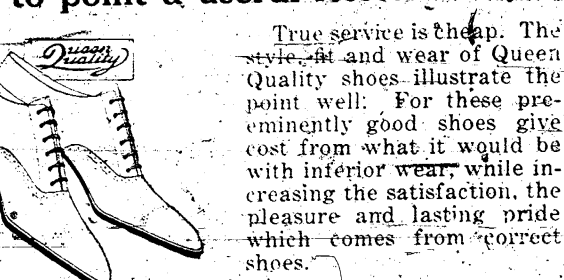
