TREATING WOUNDS OF TREES

An exposed surface is subject to attack by fungi and wood-boring insects unless properly cared for. As soon as a cut is made the wound should be treated with a disinfectant such as common creosote, which will penetrate and sterilize the wood. This may be applied with a small brush.

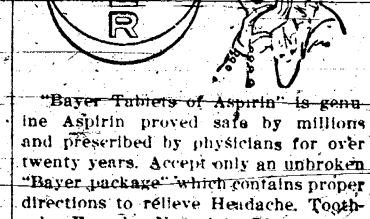

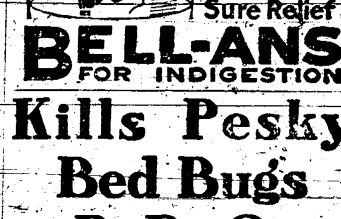

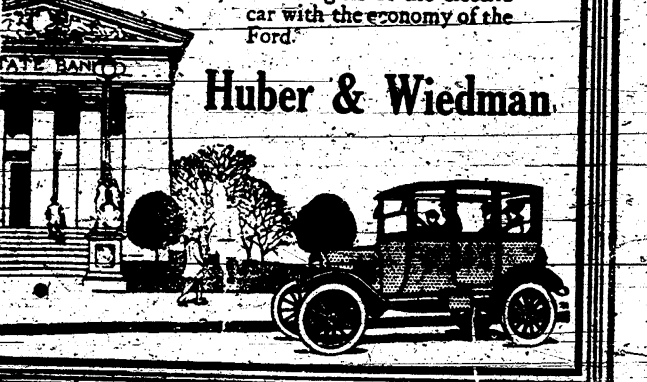
