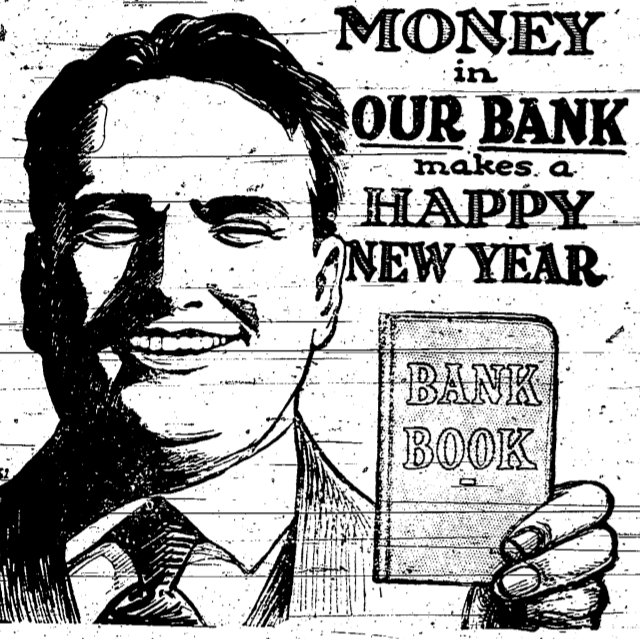

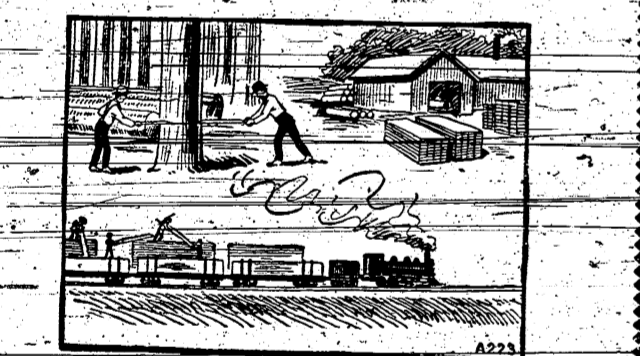

The electric furnaces of a southern plant have been diverted from various products to the manufacture of phosphoric acid and potash, such materials as synthetic pig iron, ferro-manganese and ferro-silicon being found no longer profitable. In the new industry, as described by the Iron Age, phosphoric rock is smelted in the electric furnace, the phosphorus being driven off as phosphoric oxide suspended in the gases. Collection of the gases and treatment by electrical precipitation yields the phosphoric acid as a fine powder, which on further treatment and concentration becomes a superior product, free from the impurities usual when sulphuric acid is the dissolving agent. American sales are similarly treated for the production of potash, which is precipitated as a potassium carbonate, washed, filtered in the gases, and precipitated and collected.
