FORD PRODUCING 4000 CARS A DAY

Present Production Greater Than for Same Period

Ford is building cars at full speed. And, according to an official statement from the factory at Detroit, the demand for Ford cars and trucks still exceeds the output, despite the fact that a new high level of production

By the first of May the figures representing daily production were in the neighborhood of 4,000 a day, so the May schedule was set at 101,125 cars and trucks, not including the output of Ford Canadian plant or any of the foreign assembling plants.
