check by keeping melon and cucumber plants well dusted with tobacco dust or air slacked lime. This makes the plants distasteful to the insects and they disappear.

Sow rutabaga seed about the middle of June? They require four to six weeks longer to complete their growth than the common turnips.

Be sure to pinch out the tips of all new black raspberry canes. This should he deene when the shoots are 18 to 24 inches high to insure low, stocky, well-branched plants.

Keep alt blossoms picked from the newly seet strawberry plants.

Keep all blossoms picked from the newly set strawberry plants. They should not be allowed to bear fruit the first season, except the everbearing varieties which are usually allowed to bear a crop of fruit during the fall months.

Only two or three plants should be left in each hill of melons, cucumbers and squashes. Wait until the work of the striped beetle is over, then thin the plants, leaving only the best to produce a crop.


