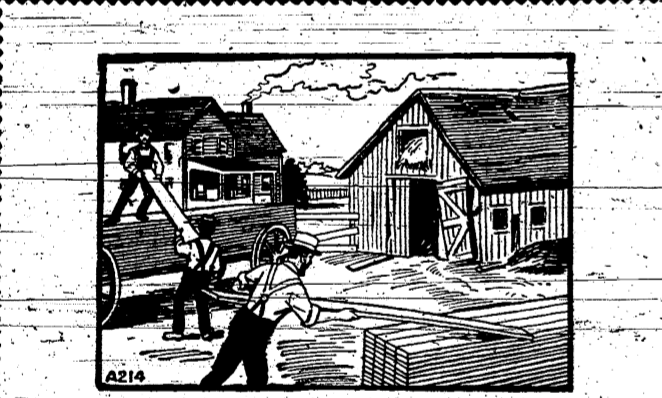

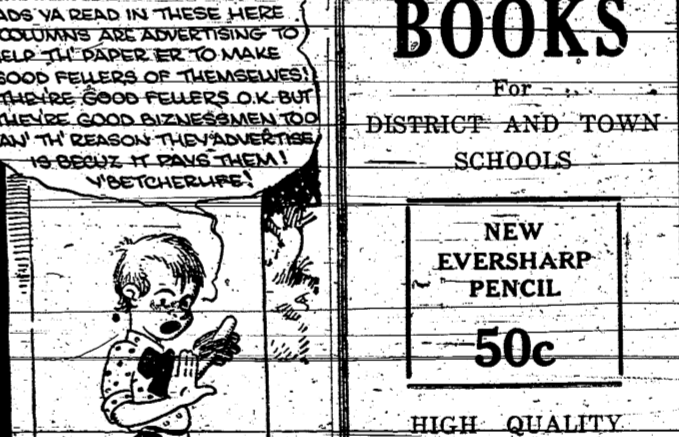


A musical comedy sketch dealing with the life and songs of Old Ireland is one of the pleasing features of the program of the Fine Arts Quartet.
