Washington—Sweeping denial of charges that the Ku Klux Klan contained within its ranks 75 lawless band of hooded hoodlums was made before a house committee by William J. Simmons, of Atlanta, Ga., its founder and imperial wizard.
Turning squarely upon members who had listened intently for nearly two hours to a dramatic defense of the organization, Simmons declared that, "standing here in the presence of God," he wanted the world to know that if one-fourth part of the charges were true he would call to "either the grand councilman of the Klan or the police to his aid in his handling it in every section of the United States."
