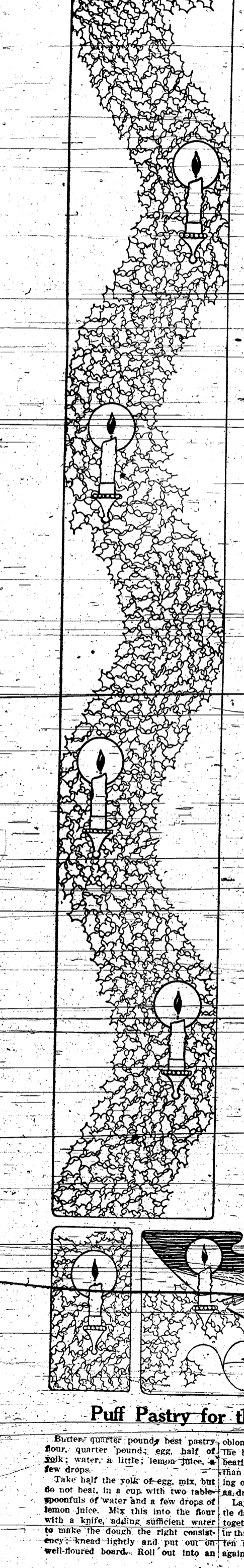
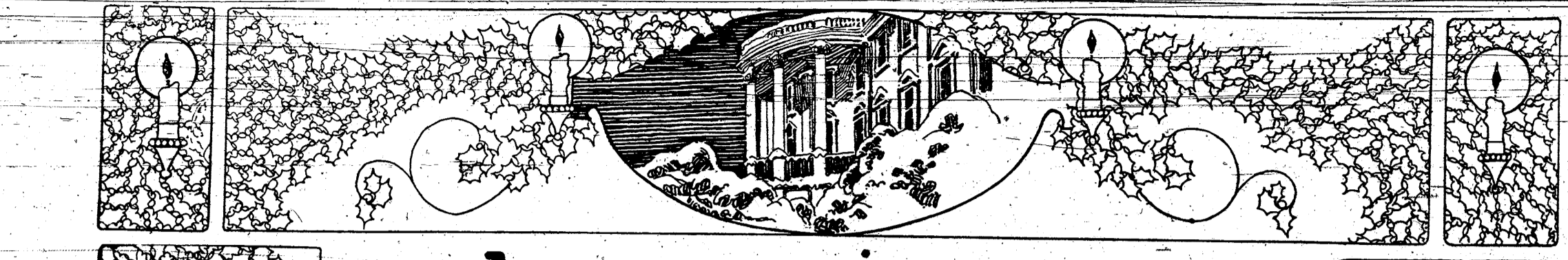
# Christmas Greetings from the President of the United States

—Grand Rapids—A central relief committee, comprising representatives of every church, lodge and other organization in the city, has been organized by Mrs. A. L. Demaree to have charge of the relief work among people in the city.

—Grand Rapids—Information received here says the Grand Rapids (Haven & Mackinac) railway will appeal to the recent decision of the Michigan county circuit court holding that it is entitled to collect a 2-cent passenger rate.

—Grand Rapids—A bill to amend the constitution of the state, providing for the election of a state auditor, was introduced in the Michigan legislature.

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## NATIONS ACCEPT NAVY REDUCTION

JAPAN AND GREAT BRITAIN SIGN HUGHES PROPOSAL FOR 5-5-3 RATIO.

ONLY SLIGHT CHANGES MADE

Washington—The United States, Great Britain and Japan have agreed to the Hughes proposal for a 5-5-3 ratio of naval armaments. The agreement is a landmark in the history of international relations.

Secretary Hughes, as chairman of the armament conference, has communicated directly with President Harding of France regarding the situation which has developed as a result of the stand of the French delegation.

Bridge Valued at Half Million Washington—The Interstate Commerce Commission announced that it had placed a tentative valuation of \$500,000 on the property of the St. Louis, Mo. Bridge company of Michigan.

Wireless Tower Demolished Window Automaton From Building Falls on Hutchinson, Killing One, Injuring Another.

Buffalo, N. Y.—A 35-mile an hour gale swept the city Sunday, uprooting trees, tearing down chimneys, blowing up the glass windows and piling up the water in the harbor to an unprecedented stage.

Two women were caught under a falling tree on Fort Ave. near the water front. One of them, Miss Margaret Cochran, sustained two broken legs. Her sister, Katherine, was severely injured.

Anti-Betting Bill Is Opposed Washington—Opposition to the passage of the present form of the Walsh anti-gambling bill prohibiting publication of betting odds by newspapers, their occupancy by newsboys, and bill before the senate judiciary committee.

May Court Marital Marriage Washington—Secretary DeWitt announced that Marion Mal Gandy, 21, of Fairmount City, was charged with violating the prohibition law by marrying a woman while her husband was still living.

Cuba Asks Troops Withdrawal Havana—Withdrawal of American troops stationed in Cuba will be requested by the government under the joint resolution passed by both houses of congress.
