NEW IMMIGRATION MEASURE PREPARED

New Plan Presented in Hope of Adjusting Matter Always in the Hands of American People. Washington, Jan. 10.—An immigration bill which will help to cement the friendly relations between the United States and the nations represented at the arms conference and particularly Japan and China, has been prepared by Senator Thomas Sterling of South Dakota, as follows: "It is hereby declared to be the policy of the United States to admit annually only so many law-abiding immigrants of any national or racial group as may be capable of being so employed as not to endanger the normal American standards of living, labor and wages, and as may be also capable of being assimilated by communities of English-speaking type and wholly incorporated into the body politic within a reasonable length of time; such capacity of employment and assimilation to be determined by the immigration board
