Well-Built House Earns Profits for Swine Raisers.

This house is of standard frame construction, a good grade of lumber being used to make it weather-tight. The building is set on a concrete foundation, and has a concrete floor. The building is 41 feet long and 24 feet wide, and is divided into four pens, six on each side. Through the center of the building runs a feeding alley, wide enough to run a feed truck, thus distributing the feed to the troughs with the least amount of labor.

The long side of the building shows in the picture facing the south. With this arrangement the windows in the side wall of the building project, permitting sunlight to strike the pens on both sides of the interior. The other type of hog house is known as the stable house, a good example of which is shown in the illustration.

The other side wall, which faces the north is also well kept out of the sun by means of the slanted window, which, because of the angle of the sun, is able to give the pens a full amount of light.

Each pen is floored with planks raised slightly from the concrete. This arrangement keeps the pens dry, and at the same time permits the water to be carried off by means of the gutter on which the bedding is placed. With this arrangement the pens are kept clean and dry, and the hogs are able to lie on a bed of straw.



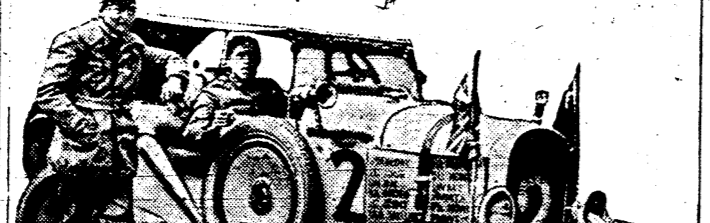

THREE AMENDMENTS TO STATE CONSTITUTION TO BE VOTED AT COMING ELECTION

IMPORTANT MATTERS TO BE CONSIDERED IN ADDITION TO ELECTION OF THE CANDIDATES FOR OFFICE—VOTERS SHOULD INFORM THEMSELVES

At the election to be held in this state on Tuesday, Nov. 7, 1922, there will be submitted to the electors three proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, as follows:
A proposed amendment to the Constitution providing that Article XIII be amended by adding a section to be known as Section 5, to read as follows:
Sec. 5. Subject to this Constitution the legislature may authorize municipalities, subject to reasonable limitations, to acquire land and property that is needed in the acquiring, opening and widening of parks, boulevards, public places, etc., in whole or in part for the excess property so appropriated, but such bonds shall be a lien only on the property so acquired and they shall not be included in any limitation of the bonded indebtedness of such municipality.
