

VOTERS, ATTENTION!

THREE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED AT FALL ELECTION

Voters Are Urged to Become Informed on Provisions of Each

At the coming November election three constitutional amendments will be sub mitted to the voters of Michigan. The one of most vital interest to voters as a whol is the amendment which would open the way for income tax legislation, and reads

> "The legislature shall provide by law a uniform rule of taxation, except on property paying specific taxes, and the taxes shall be levied on such property as shall be prescribed by law. Provision may be made by law for a tax of not to exceed four per centum upon or with respect to the net gains, profits and incomes from whatever source derived, which tax may be graduated and progressive and which may provide for reasonable exemptions. For the purpose of such tax, property and persons, firms and corporations, upon which said tax may operate may be classified. Provided, that the legislature shall provide by law a uniform rule of taxation for such property as shall be assessed by the state board of assessors, and the rate of taxation on such property shall be the rate which the state board of assessors shall ascertain and determine is the average rate levied upon other property upon which ad valorem taxes are asses ed for state, county, township and municipal purposes."

The amendment, which is to Section 3 of Article 10 of the constitution, does not make it mandatory upon the legislature to enact an income tax law, but simply opens the way for such legislation, should it be deemed necessary to meet the fina

It has been the contention of those backing the amendment, which constitute majority members of the last legislature, that the exemptions under the law should be about the same as those contained in the federal income law, and that accordingly, the burden of the tax will rest upon those of incomes in excess of \$1,000, and upon the larger corporations of the state

The backers of the income tax in the last legislature intimated that should the state enact an income tax law, as provided by the amendment, they would stand for a repeal of the corporation franchise fee law, which is netting the state about \$6.

The other two amendments to be submitted are: One providing for the granting of right to municipalities to acquire land and property in excess of that needed for parks, boulevards, streets, etc., and issue bonds for the payment of same; and an amendment to provide for the incorporation of ports and port districts with power to engage in work of internal improvements in connection therewith.

The amendment which would provide for the incorporation of ports and port districts is fathered by Detroit, but also has the backing of such Michigan port cities as Benton Harbor, Bay City, Muskegon, Holland, and others. Should the amendment pass, it would permit municipalities to incorporate ports and port districts, and to sell bends for the improvement of such ports. Under the wording of the amendment, the question of a bond issue would be submitted to the district included in the creation of the port district, and no bonds could be sold holding on property without the district. This amendment would open the way for municipal piers and warehou the general improvement of Michigan harbors on the Great Lake

The third amendment, which would provide for excess condemnation of land, is also backed by the city of Detroit. It would provide for the acquiring of land along boulevards, or adjoining parks, to be beautified, or which might become a part of the improvement in the future. Under the present provisions, condemnation proceedings may be followed to acquire only the necessary land needed for any specific public improvement. This amendment is of particular interest to all cities in the state, as it would greatly broaden the powers of the city commission, city councils, and board of education in acquiring more land than is needed for contemplated public improvements.
