ELEPHANT HUNT ON BELLE ISLE

Exciting Event That Took Place When Sheba Went for a Walk.

Old residents of Detroit often tell stories of exciting events that took place up and down the water course which is the cutlet of the Great Lakes, in early days. They tell of Lakes, in early days. They tell of boar hunts on Hog Island, now re-named Belle Isle, which is the play-

ground of the city.

Hog Island was visited mainly by Indian hunters and trappers, and later by an occasional smuggler or men fleeing from justice. On ac-count of the number of rattle snakes on the island a Frenchman who had acquired the land put a drove of hogs there to destroy the snakes, and

the island became known as Hog Island. Indians used to tell about battles fought there between the French and English soldiers and sportsmen used to tell about boar hunts pulled off there at different We have sometimes listened to the stories and treasured them a splendid samples of American fic-

splendid samples of American fiction.

But it remains for the newspaper of today, June, 1923, to tell about an elephant hunt that took place Monday morning on beautiful Belle Isle, the Detroit playground. The children of the city contributed their cents, nickels and dimes to purchase a small female elephant in New York city, as an addition to the zoo. The animal was placed on a truck and in three days arrived at Buffalo where she was put on board a steamer and brought to Detroit the next morning, when an immense throng morning, when an immense throng of people, especially school children, met Sheba at the dock and welcomed her to her new home in the coming greatest city in the U.S. A. After parading about the city, Sheba was taken to Belle Isle, where a stall had been prepared for her. She was a well behaved Miss Elephant, but undoubtedly became a little homesick after the excitement was

nomesick after the excitement was over.

At any rate the next morning at 4 o'clock when everything was wrapped in silence and dew, or was supped in silence and dew, or was supposed to be, a sudden cray "Sheba is out!" aroused the sleepers and a wild chase took place. Every policeman, animal keeper, and care taker hustled hither and yon in search of the lost elephant. At last she was discovered strolling liesurely across a broad lawn, flower beds and all. They called to her and coaxed, but she only increased her pace. Finally a man ran up and catching at her neck strap cried out "Aha, I've got her"—but she got him. Rich Iron Ore Vein in Russia More interesting than most of the erent news from Russia is the report that a scientific mission, supported by soviet government, has discovered in the province of Kursk, 300 miles south of Moscow, a vast vein of iron ore 150 miles long, which explains an old mystery. Fifty years ago it was noted that in this region the compass was deflected as much as 15 degrees from the magnetic north, and magnetic ore was supposed to be the cause but numerous borings revealed no trace of it Either the soviet scientists have applied new scientific de vices or they have worked with more assiduity than their predecessors. They found the ore at a depth of from 500 to 800 feet, and hope that it will develop into one of the world's largest fields. This discovery in Russia may have great economic and political importance for Europe. — Springfield (Mass.) Republican.






