FARM VALUES IN COUNTY CUT

Valuation of Real and Personal Property of County However Is Raised \$3,777,348.

The county supervisors as a board of equalization of tax roll met at the court house in Ann Arbor Monday and placed the assessment of real estate at \$75,147,975 and personal property at \$12,424,778, a total of \$87,572,753, an increase of \$3,777,343 over the 1922 assessment.

Township and city valuations of real estate and personal property is as follows: Ann Arbor city, real estate \$53,220,600, personal property \$6,220,300; Ann Arbor township \$2,408,040 and \$246,700; Augusta township \$1,592,115 and \$150,750; Bridgewater township \$1,493,350 and \$171,750; Dexter township \$1,213,125 and \$200,600; Lima township \$1,757,919 and \$318,105; Lodi township \$1,752,610 and \$197,225; Lyndon township \$663,670 and \$55,250; Anchester township \$2,018,475 and \$324,075; Northfield township \$1,500,515 and \$145,200; Pittsfield township \$2,247,000 and \$222,855; Salem township \$1,345,200 and \$186,905; Saline township \$2,225,340 and \$319,775; Superior township \$2,479,825 and \$504,050; Webster township \$1,361,560 and \$130,010; York township \$3,510,025 and \$333,700; Ypsilanti township \$2,277,229 and \$359,430; Ypsilanti city first district \$4,674,140 and \$1,057,625; and Ypsilanti city second district \$1,440,275 and \$294,550.

Assessments were lowered in 15 of the 20 townships, but the increase in Ann Arbor City valuation more than made up the difference. The board realized that many farms were assessed for more than they would sell for.
