FORGOT THEIR OLD ENMITY

Dinner Brought About Complete Rec onciliation Between Disraeli and One-Time Opponent.

An interesting instance of a dinner of reconciliation between those es tranged in politics was that at which Disraeli and Lord Carrington buried the hatchet in London. In 1832 Lord Carrington, then Robert Smith, was Disraeli's opponent at the hustings The contest left them with such em bittered relations that for six years they did not speak; but in December 1838, Disraeli met on the road near Bradenham "a cortege of dandles and grooms"-who were about to call on him conveying an invitation from Lord Carrington to dine at Wycombe abbey. At first Disraeli refused, but pressed by Lord Forrester, Carrington's brother-in-law, he afterward con

The completeness of the reconciliation may be judged by some extracts from Disraeli's dairy, remarks the Detroit News. "Our party was rather noisy, but very gay. I did not get home until past midnight, or rather near the chimes of 1. . . . I could scarcely resist their entreaties that I should remain and send for my toilette in the morning."

Privileged Mendicants.

Blue gowns, or Beadsmen, was an order of privileged mendicants of Scotwhich the latest trace did not expire till 1863. The first appellation was due to the distribution among these persons of a gown of blue cloth to which were added a loaf of bread, a bottle of ale and a leather purse con taining a penny for every year of the ruling sovereign's age. Annually a hore a pewter badge, on which were inscribed his name and the words past and repast.

The usage, which had its origin in the ancient practice of vicarious prayer, resolved itself into a public charity, of which the sources were forgotten, and in 1833 60 Beadsmen were on the roll. No appointments were made after that date, and the last survivor drew his allowance from the exchequer at Edinburgh in May, 1868.

The General Grant tree has a diameter of 35 feet, while the General Sherman measures 361/2 feet in diameter. This park has an area of but four square miles, yet every mile of it is packed brimming full of un asually attractive scenery.

MIRROR NOT HARD TO SILVER

Formula That Almost Any One Can Put Together Is Guaranteed to Do the Work

The Scientific American gives the ollowing formula for silvering glass: (a) Reducing solution—In twelve unces of water dissolve twelve grains of Rochelle salts and boil. Add, while polling, sixteen grains of nitrate of silver, dissolved in one ounce of water and continue the boiling for ten minutes more; then add water to make twelve ounces (h) Silvering solution -Dissolve one-ounce of nitrate of sliver in ten ounces of water; then add liquid ammonia until the brown precipitate is nearly, but not quite, all dissolved; then add one ounce of alcohol and sufficient water to make twelve ounces. To silver-Take equal parts of a and b, mix thoroughly and lay the glass, face down, on the of the mixture while wet, after it has been carefully cleaned with soda and well rinsed with clean water. Distilled water should be used for making the solutions. About two drams of each will silve a plate two inches square. The dish in which the silvering is don should be only a little larger than the glass. The solution should stand and settle for two or three days before be ing used. It will keep good a long

WILL ADD TO

Much Needed Room to Be Procured By Building Addition to Old

Structure in This Village. At an adjourned meeting of school istrict No. 2, held at the high school building Monday evening to receiv the report of a committee consist-ing of Peter Scheurer, A. J. Waters and R. G. Sorter on the proposition of providing more room for present needs of the school, it was practically decided to build an addition 24x30

feet and two stories high on the west side of the present building.

The meeting brought forth much discussion of the needs and the fut-ure of the school, during which the idea of building an entirely new structure now and then correct as the

idea of building an entirely new structure now and then came to the surface. This phase of the matter, however, did not come up for discussion and it is evident that those who have been attending school meeting of late are not planning on a new building, in fact the large majority are seeking to put the date as far into the future as possible.

At the annual meeting of the district, held two weeks ago three propositions came up, namely: building two new rooms for use of the school, purchasing a portable building, and purchasing one of the adjacent residences and converting it into two class rooms.

The report of the committee Monday evening indicated that the portable building proposition had been placed in the discard. The John Dresselhouse and John Delker properties could be bought for \$3.500 and \$2.500 respectively, and a price of \$1.800 was given for a frame addition to the present building 24x30 feet, with a surface of Kellaston. feet, with a surface of Kellastone, and a flat roof. The addition will join the corner of the west stairway tower, extending toward the front of the building, thus creating a court of the present girls' entrance. Entrance to the addition will be free. a court of the present girls' entrance. Entrance to the addition will be from the stair tower. Members of the school board are convinced that the present heating plant wil supply all needs. The school board is given authority to construct the addition or purchase either of the residences above mentioned but the choice of above mentioned, but the choice of those present was for the addition. The sum recommended by the board to be raised for the year's expenses, at the annual meeting, was \$2,000 less than last year and \$4,000 less than two years ago, so providing of the two needed rooms will not add more expense than the average of the past two years.
