

To Convert Fuel Oil From Farm Crop Waste While there has been talk and experimentation for several years about obtaining several by-products from corn stalks and other farm waste, the United States department of agriculture now comes out with a full-fledged program for extracting liquid motor, fuel from corncobs peanut shells, flax shives, out hulls, cottonsed bulls and burs and sugar cottonsed bulls and burs and sugar ottonseed hulls and burs and sugar ane bagasse and other farm waste.

Experimentations have advanced to the semi-works stage at the D of A. northern regional research laboratory at Peoria, III., and results are so promising that the work is to be enlarged so that it now may be evaluated on a semi-commer.
