## ISLE ROYALE, A DIFFERENT TOURIST ATTRACTION

Rock Harbor, Isle Royale, Michigan, is not the usual tourist attraction. It is a national park, the only island wilderness within the continental United States, and provides an ideal wartime hideout from the atomic bomb.

The average island is not readily accessible to travelers by passenger boat. Mackinac Island is an hour's distance from Mackinac City, St. James on Beaver Island is three and one-half hours from Charlevoix. But Isle Royale is reached by a single boat, the Copper Harbor, at the tip of the scenic, mountainous Keweenaw peninsula, on a 50-foot-deep, narrow channel. The Copper Harbor, piloted by a sturdy fisherman, Captain Charles Kautz, takes five hours to make the 40-mile run from the tip of the Keweenaw to the national park hotel concession.

When the waves run along Lake Superior, as is occasionally the case, the traveler is treated to a first-rate miniature of an ocean voyage with sea sickness and all the boat rolls and bobs. You roll and bob with it.

To the heavy traveler, this may be an adventure with a capital A. List to others who prefer to stay in their comfort although they are far away from home, the combination may tax human resilience. And those who are predisposed to sea sickness may make the best of the situation and "grin and bear it."

(Note: Seasickness may be prevented or minimized by observation of the following precautions: Do not take food for five or six hours before sailing; inhale plenty of fresh air while on board; drink strong coffee and eat an occasional lump of sugar; take a good D.D. anti-sea sickness medicine; if necessary, try small doses of chloroform, a compound of chloroform and bromide of potassium, by a physician's prescription. Or, better yet, try to avoid it.)

Assuming that you'll enjoy (as well as survive) the lake trip, here's what you may expect to find at this rocky national park with around 400 chartered inlets surrounding it like a moat.

Although still in Michigan, the island is only 19 miles from Minnesota and 10 miles from Thunder Bay, on the Canadian shore. Geologically it is part of the Keweenaw peninsula which accounts for the presence of native copper.

Your lodging will be limited to one of three hotels: Rock Harbor (which is 11 miles long); Belle Isle Camp on the island; and Windigo Inn on Washington Harbor at the western end and closest to Minnesota.

Only the Rock Harbor lodge was open in 1945. American plan daily rates per person at the guest houses: Single, \$12; single beds, \$5.50; double bed, \$6.25. Cabin rates: Single, \$6; single beds, \$2.75; double beds, \$3.50.

For 1946 tourist information write to George E. Bagley, superintendent, Isle Royale National Park, via Duluth, Minn.

Because the Isle Royale Park is so new—it was authorized by Congress in 1931 and formally created April, 1940—you may prefer to wait several years when adequate and modern facilities should be available of a standard to be found in other national parks.

The park has its own postwar program. Three hotel buildings, privately built, will be raised. New lodges and cabins, complete to electricity and sewage disposal are to be constructed in their places. The Windigo Inn and the Belle Isle Camp will have accommodations for 200 persons each. Rock Harbor lodge likewise is to be expanded.

There are no roads on the island. No automobiles, no bridge paths. Travel is limited to foot and water. Because pedestrian travel is slow, you may prefer to use a boat to get around and visit places. The long harbors and hundreds of islands, wood districts provide many inner waterways, safeguarded from the lake. Travel is by rowboat, outward motorcraft or canoe.

If you expect to gaze upon the forest primieval with virgin timber towering high, you'll be disappointed. Isle Royale has been swept, repeatedly by fire.

Prehistoric mining pits, dug by Indians, show traces of wood fire. Much of the island was ravaged by forest fires the most recent conflagration being in 1936.

Yet, despite the absence of these white pines and hemlocks, such as you will find in parts of the Porcupine Mountain area and along the Pesago Isle area and rivers that lake support, Isle Royale possesses a peculiar beauty and charm of its own. It is different.

## NEW BANGS DISEASE LAW EFFECTIVE SOON

A new law listed a Public Act No. 290, of the Regular Session of 1945, will be of much importance to farmers and especially livestock dealers who buy and sell cattle, states Charles F. Kapp, Commissioner of Agriculture.

The Act provides that all cattle that are sold or moved to another state within twelve months of age, shall be accompanied by a certificate of record which shall be issued by the Commissioner of Agriculture, showing the animal to be negative to a Bang's disease test on thirty days or that the cattle originated from a herd which was tested and the entire herd reported and the ninety days prior to such sale or movement.

The Act provides that it shall not apply to steers or cattle being moved for immediate slaughter.

Vaccinated cattle over twelve months of age must have the same certificate unless they were vaccinated between the ages of four and eight months and were one year of age at the time of vaccination and properly recorded with the Department of Agriculture.

## RIGHT TEMPERATURE HARD TO GET IN OVEN CANNING

Canning in the oven is not recommended say food specialists. With this method there is danger because it is difficult to get a safe processing temperature that is one which will destroy bacteria and other organisms.

Penetration of heat is much slower in the oven than in the boiling-water bath because air is a poor conductor of heat. Although the oven temperature may reach 250 degrees or higher, the food inside the partially sealed jar is seldom heated above the boiling point. This temperature is not high enough for canning of meats, vegetables or fruits.

If the jars are sealed before they are put into the oven or if they are sealed by any means such as by syrup boiling out or by rubber rings or sealing compound, the temperature is not high enough for canning in an explosion, since there is pressure on the inside but not on the outside of the jar. When a pressure cooker is used there is pressure both inside and outside the jar.

## CARROTS OFFER MUCH AS WHOLESOME FOOD

Carrots offer much in appetizing color, fine flavor and nutritive value. To make the most of vitamins, minerals and fiber, home economists offer the following cooking suggestions.

If carrots are peeled, peel thin, or scrape no more than skin deep. Young tender carrots may not need to be peeled. Just enough water to prevent sticking to the pan is all that young tender carrots need. Older ones need enough water to cover. Have the water boiling before putting in the carrots. Cover the kettle to speed the cooking, save fuel and conserve vitamins.

Cook only until tender. Young carrots cook in 15 to 20 minutes, older ones in 20 to 25 minutes. Slicing or dicing shortens the cooking but may mean greater loss of vitamin C.

Variety in seasoning helps prevent monotony. If carrots are served frequently a nice sauce over the top, chopped parsley, or tender onion sprouts, or chopped onion, are good for pouring over carrots.

## REVENUES FROM HUNTERS SHOW DROP FOR LAST YEAR

Hunters spent \$15,371.15 for 7,505,226 hunting licenses during the 1945 season, the Fish and Game Service reported. These totals represent a decrease of \$5,829.12, or 28 percent, from the previous year.

In revenue received, Pennsylvania led all states with \$1,367,472. Next in line was Michigan with \$1,026,416, followed by New York with \$221,705; California, \$203,579; Wisconsin, \$204,694; Ohio, \$203,614; Washington, \$202,827; Minnesota, \$443,612; Colorado, \$472,789; and South Dakota, \$465,002.

In number of licenses issued, Michigan topped the list with 732,479, followed by New York with 580,864; Pennsylvania, 528,547; Ohio, 460,533; Indiana, 341,818; Minnesota, 327,476; Wisconsin, 301,323; California, 282,495; and Illinois, 263,374.

Since the total of 3,552,226 licenses includes 624,177 big game licenses, in addition to small game licenses required by Colorado, Michigan, South Dakota, Utah and Wyoming, there is a duplication of licenses in these states. Many big game hunters undoubtedly purchased small game licenses; and, when that occurred, two license sales were recorded for each hunter.

## GOOD DEEDS MAY AFFECT OUR FIGHTING PROGRESS

Fighting accomplishments of armies in World War II may be dependent on adequacy of national diets, according to Dr. Agnes Fay Morgan of the University of California. She points out that the protein diets of Germany and France fell to the same order as the mortality statistics; the death rates were 110 per 10,000 population for Germany, and 184 for France.

The better German record, in health as in war, may originate in the higher milk, fruit, and vegetable portion, or the lower amount of cereal and sugar in the national diet, she believes. Likewise, she indicates that the B vitamin content of the German bread is high, since the French eat white bread made with little or no yeast, while German bread is whole-grain, largely rye, and made with yeast. She says that German beer is a fair source of B vitamins, but French wine is poor.

The food of the Russians is similar in vitamin content to that of the Germans, Dr. Morgan explains. The whole-grain yeast bread, vegetables, milk and meat which they eat may account for their physical and psychological stamina, usually characteristic of the well-nourished.

## USE OF PAINT FOR PROTECTION VERY OLD

Use of protective and decorative coatings is one of the very oldest practices of the human race. Perhaps Noah was the first painter, for he "painted his ark within and without" to protect it against the perils of flood. The Greeks, too, applied a preservative to their ships so that "neither the sea, nor the wind, nor the sun could destroy the wood thus protected." The earliest existing proofs of the use of paint are the colorful drawings of bison found on the smooth walls of the caves at Las Eyzies in southern Europe. The age of these drawings which were skillfully done in tones of brown, red and black, evidently with earth pigments, never were touched by sunlight and are believed to be no less than 20,000 years old and possibly 10 times that age. Commonly, they are credited to the Cro-Magnon period of man's development. Probably the next earliest paintings still in existence are those in the ancient Egyptian tombs, which, for thousands of years, also were preserved in darkness.

## Baked Fish

Baked fish is a tasty dish. Stuff the fish with a bread dressing and bake at a high temperature for 10 minutes, then lower the heat. Fish being a protein food, cooks more tenderly with low heat. Whatever fish you catch or buy you have an excellent source of protein, vitamins and some fish have considerable fat. If it is only natural that fish and shell fish should be abundant in some of the minerals needed in our daily meals. For centuries the remainder of the world has carried minerals from the surface of the land into the oceans and the lakes where the minerals are assimilated by plant and animal life.

EMPEROR ONCE DEMOCRAT...  
Twenty-five years ago, this writer, visiting in Japan, got considerable first-hand information about the emperor from a young Japanese Quaker, Kanzo Sawada, who had been picked to accompany Hirohito, then crown prince, on a trip to see the western world.

Why Sawada, educated in a Quaker school in Tokyo, was chosen to accompany the young prince on this historic-making trip, I do not know, except that the Imperial council of education wanted a companion of Hirohito's age who spoke English and French to travel with the future emperor.

Never before had a ruler of Japan left his shores. In the past scarcely was an emperor seen by his subjects. Some idea of his isolation can be gained from the fact that the word "mika" means "awful"; the word "do" means "place"; and the name "Mikado" means "awful place."

In those days, priests came to worship at the "awful place," but they never saw the emperor whose other name even today is "Tennu," meaning "son of Heaven."

Thus came the cult of Shintoinism which actually means "rule of the superior" or "way of the Gods."

In fact, some of the more intense patriots actually threw themselves on the railroad tracks on the train carrying Hirohito to Yokohama in protest against the departure.

Naturally Hirohito may have changed a lot during the 25 years since he was crowned emperor. Also his friend Sawada was probably in his fifties. However, the story of that voyage was one of a young man anxious to mingle with his fellow-men, attend the emperor's worshipers by wrestling on the deck with his side, get a bloody nose and dance ecstatically with the servants of the Duke of Aizu in the same "barbaric" Scotland, which, according to Shinto priests, is made from the mud and seafoam left over after creation of the "heavenly isles" — Japan.

Hirohito even managed to deliver a public speech to the lord mayor of London, and no emperor in all the history of Japan had ever delivered a public speech before in all Japanese history, furthermore, no emperor had purchased an article of any shape or form in Paris, however, Hirohito insisted on going alone and buying a necktie, and later a pearl for his mother.

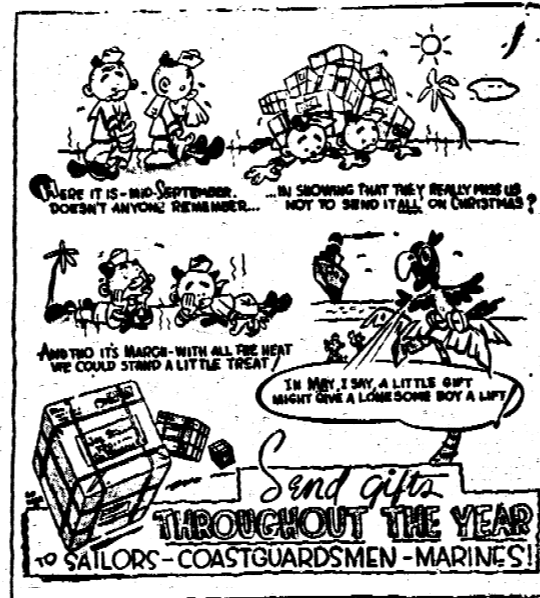

the forest green background. Two aerial surveys last winter revealed the presence of approximately 100 moose. There are no deer, bear, porcupines and poisonous snakes.

The island is patrolled throughout the winter by the rangers who hike on snowshoes over a 150-mile circuit each month, staying overnight at cabins spaced about ten miles apart. The rangers watch for poachers in great value.

isle Royale is one of the few remaining wilderness areas left in Michigan when an outdoor lover can hike the island, his own camp inside a rickrack and a sleeping bag, and spend literally days or weeks beyond the night of civilization as we know it now.

Quick airplane service will remove the risk of seasickness in crossing the lake. But even that hazard and inconvenience should be well repaid.

We don't know whether you will like Isle Royale. At least, you ought to visit it and find out for yourself during the next five years.

Personally we want to return to this wilderness island, just off the Canadian coast of Lake Superior.

Like you, we want to know more about our own wonderful Michigan and our own United States.

And, on the other hand, just think how miserable you would be now if all your prayers had been answered!
