Lest summer was a record season for such losses. Yet homemakers can bring this damage down to almost zero by simple methods: cleanliness, the use of preventive chemicals and the proper packing and

ness, the use of preventive chemi-cals, and the proper packing and storage of woolen garments while not in use.

The need for preventive treat-ment is greater now than ever be-fore. Ruin of a single garment may not seem a disaster to the person who has money to replace it, but multiplied by many garments it be-comes a sessious matter when every comes a sexious matter when ever additional yard of fabric requires vital raw materials and more man-

vital raw materials and more manpower.

Whenever possible, garments subject to moth damage should be
washed before storing to rid them
of the soil, spots, and grease which
