GPS WILL WANT TO RETURN TO COLLEGE

(By Gene Alteman)

How would you like to sit in the shoes of a college president?

If the shoes were those of the president of Michigan State College, that one-time cow college at East Lansing, whose enrollment has kept growing persistently every year since 1900, you would be confronted with a sorry predicament.

Lately Dr. John A. Hannah, president, and Judge J. W. Mead, its only jurist, have provided opportunity of higher education to every Michigan boy and girl who wants to enroll here. We are expecting a great influx of Michigan war veterans whose education was interrupted by the war.

The old Michigan State College will go to college in the new building which will be completed in many years. While the returning service men and women are pouring into the college, the old Michigan State College must provide educational opportunities to many young people that ever before.

One problem is the lack of space to house them. It is estimated that the Michigan State College will have a high peak of 11,647—before it is over.

These considerations are building attention. We have had no state appropriation for a classroom building since 1926, more than 15 years ago. Today the shortage of classrooms is so critical that the temporary three-story building additions were reduced in December to one hour each. We are unable to provide adequate compensation for the returning service men.

Do you see the problem? The problem of financing education for the returning service men is not fully understood by the public. Here's another headache.

The GI bill of rights for war veterans has been interpreted by Washington to underwrite the payment of the college student. In the case of Michigan State College, Uncle Sam would pay \$120 annually for each Michigan veteran and \$120 for each who has been honorably discharged since World War I.

The old 1944 license plates must be turned in when purchasing 1946 plates and further notice.

Plant Trees in Fall Or Early Winter

Best Results Secured From Local Grown Ones
Trees, fruit or shade as well as for fuel and lumber, can be set out any time during the fall or early winter, so long as the ground is not frozen more than two or three inches. If the ground is frozen at planting time, no frozen soil should be used in firming the earth about the roots.

Fall planting is recommended in order that the young trees will have time to become established and the roots will make some growth in the fall and early spring before they start to grow.

Fall and early winter planting of trees is great demand for water by the expanding leaves.
