

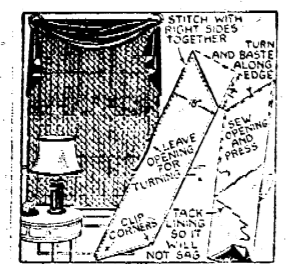






Plain Draped Valance With Sheer Curtains

EVEN the plainest of straight net or sheer curtains will take on an air of elegance without being too formal if you add a simple draped valance. Such a valance is also pretty with ruffled curtains, and it may be made of figured chintz as well as of plain material.



Feetlong rings at the upper corners of the window frame are all that you need in the way of drapery fixtures. The diagrams show how to cut and line the valance which is pulled through these rings. You can avoid pleatings by using 36-inch-wide material cut lengthwise. A half width makes the depth of the valance. The length is the width of the window plus the amount to hang down at each side.
