And Easy to Operate THE electric pig brooder is fast This electric pig brooder is tast becoming popular and profitable on farms where pigs are farrowed in late winter or early spring. The brooder prevents chilling and keeps sows from lying on pigs—the com-mon causes of losses. Death losses of early spring pigs were reduced from 34.3 to 16.9 per

For the first few days use a 190-watt lamp if the weather is ex-tremely cold. At the end of a week, a 60-watt bulb may supply evough heat. When pigs are 10 days or two weeks old, heat can be discontinued. It is important to use a rubber-covered thop extension cord com-plete with rubber-covered socket.
