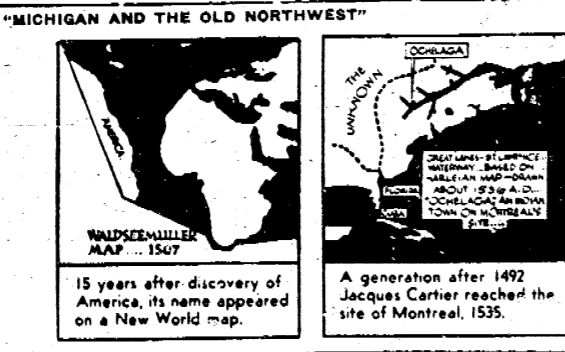
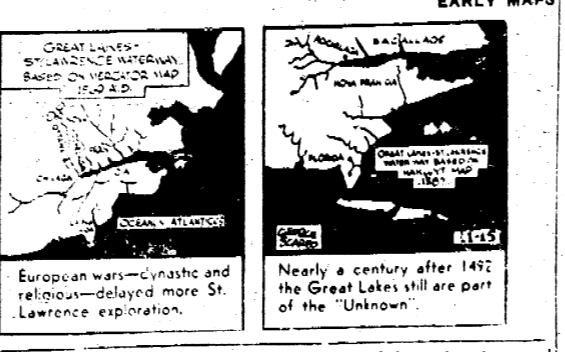


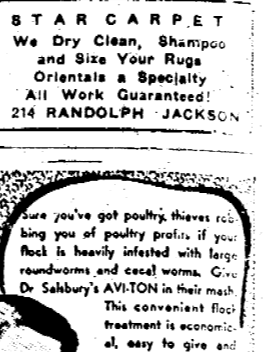

EVERY INVESTOR A JOB MAKER UNDER PRICE ENTERPRISE
GOV. RAYMOND E. BALLWIN of Connecticut, in an article in the American Magazine, says we need job makers. The fact is we now have more than 50 million job makers. They are the American jobs and Mary Dooks whose money is invested in the plants and tools of industry. They have made jobs for more than 50 million workers.

So it is that industry becomes a three way partnership of capital, labor and management, each dependent upon the other.
Those 50 million investors have hired their dollars out to industry. They rightfully expect their dollars will earn a reasonable wage. That wage is the dividend industry pays to the investor. It averages less than four cents a year for each working dollar. That is certainly not an excessive price for workers and management to pay for the tools of production, the tools that create jobs.

Management receives for its technical knowledge, its know-how, without which industry would not operate, less than one half of 1 per cent of what is produced.
Out of each dollar of value produced labor receives approximately 40 cents. Of the three partners labor is the only one that assumes, or accepts, no responsibility, and from which the government demands more as it does from the other two partners of production. Labor should share in that responsibility as it does in the receipt.

WITH ALL ITS FAULTS IT'S A RURAL CITY
THIS TOWN IS just like New York, said the taxi driver who has migrated from the eastern metropolis to Los Angeles. That is true insofar as street congestion is concerned, but there the similarity ends. New York is a great metropolitan city, and its people are on the average, more provincial than those of any country village in the nation.
The average New Yorker knows nothing of, and is not interested in, anything outside of New York City. To them education stops at the Hudson river, but the city is distinctly metropolitan. Los Angeles is a big sprawling overgrown country village in which one story false fronts are mixed with towering skyscrapers. Climatic conditions have attracted its residents from all sections of America. It has a larger proportion of lame, bald, blind and freaks per 1,000 of population than any other place on the continent. It is abundant in fakes of every possible description. It is a mammoth dime museum, but it is neither metropolitan nor provincial. Personally I'd

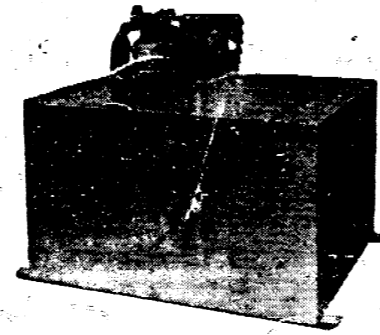

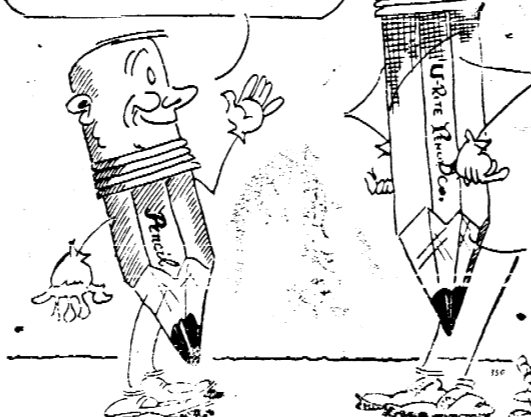
